

# BEING AN EXAMPLE, MY PRIORITY By Audrey Kum

n Mother's Day, 10 May 2009, Senior Associate Pastor Petrina Guneratnam took the opportunity to appreciate the biological and spiritual mothers of the Church.

She began her message by telling us two stories. The first was about a daughter's gift to her mother and the second, about a mother's gift to her daughter. As we listened, we could see the great influence that mothers have on their children either for evil or for good.

In the first story (Mark 6:17-28), Herodias, had committed adultery with King Herod and wanted to kill John the Baptist who spoke against it. Her chance came when her daughter danced before King Herod on his birthday and Herod was so pleased that he promised to give her anything up to half of his kingdom. The girl asked her mother what she should ask for. She answered, "The head of John the Baptist!" The








girl obeyed and we saw clearly that this mother influenced her daughter for evil.

The second story was about a woman of Canaan who asked Jesus to heal her demon-possessed daughter (Matthew 15:21-28). Jesus commended her for her great faith and her daughter was healed that very hour. This mother did not pass on bitterness, vengeance and violence to her daughter but gave her the gift of an example of great faith.

Sister Petrina challenged us to leave a legacy of genuine faith for all who walk after us, thereby ensuring that the next generation will be greatly blessed. +

he more we envision heaven, the more we will be motivated to live the Christian life God's way. We lack the knowledge and conviction of heaven. That is why many Christians lead a carnal life. Is heaven real and what is heaven like?

The apostle John gives us a glimpse of heaven. He says, "Now I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away. Also there was no more sea. Then I, John, saw the holy city, New Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from heaven saying, 'Behold, the tabernacle of God is with men, and He will dwell with them, and they shall be His people. God Himself will be with them and be their God. And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes; there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying. There shall be no more pain, for the former things have passed away" (Revelation 21:1-4). "There shall be no night there: They need no lamp nor light of the sun, for the Lord God gives them light. And they shall reign forever and ever" (Revelation 22:5). Furthermore, the glory

of the New Jerusalem (Revelation 21:9-21) was revealed to John.

John continues to say, "But I saw no temple in it, for the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are its temple. The city had no need of the sun or of the moon to shine in it, for the glory of God illuminated it. The Lamb is its light. And the nations of those who are saved shall walk in its light, and the kings of the earth bring their glory and honor into it. Its gates shall not be shut at all by day (there shall be no night there). And they shall bring the glory and the honor of the nations into it. But there shall by no means enter it anything that defiles, or causes an abomination or a lie, but only those who are written in the Lamb's Book of Life" (Revelation 21:22-27).

Heaven is a real, beautiful and perfect place. But who may go there? There are only two places a man can go after death. It is either to heaven or hell. King David asked, "LORD, who may abide in Your tabernacle? Who may dwell in Your holy hill?" (Psalm 15:1). In other words, "Who will go to heaven? Who will be able to live where you live?" These are relevant questions.

As children of God who want to go to heaven, we should live on earth as we would live in heaven. Children from royal families are trained to live as kings and queens from birth. They do not wait until they are crowned before they live like royalty. They are disciplined from young so that when the time comes for them to be kings, it will be a natural progression. This is also true for believers. God wants us to live like children of the Most High God. We are saved, cleansed and called to live as kings and priests. John says, "...To Him who loved us and washed us from our sins in His own blood, and has made us kings and priests to His God and Father, to Him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen" (Revelation 1:5-6).

God is in the process of discipling and training us by the Word of God so that we will live like kings and priests. When it is time for us to go to heaven, we will comfortably continue to be kings and priests to God. We must check our calendar and appointments. Do our activities reflect our love for God and our desire to live as kings and priests as He has called us? If we really love God and live with a heavenly vision, we will make

time for God in our lives and His kingdom will be our priority.

In Psalm 15, King David gives us the following characteristics of kings and priests who may "dwell in God's sanctuary and live in His holy hill" as citizens of heaven:

1. "He whose walk is blameless and who does what is righteous, who speaks the truth from his heart" (Psalm 15:2, NIV).

#### THEY ARE BLAMELESS

Being blameless means living a life in agreement with God's moral law with complete integrity and without hidden sins. It is not our talents, charisma, education or wealth that makes us blameless. Only the blood of Jesus makes us blameless. John says, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved. He who believes in Him is not condemned: but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God (John 3:16-18). God sees us as pure, clean and acceptable because of Jesus Christ and his blood. That is why the Bible says, "There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit" (Romans 8:1).

When we receive Christ, a new birth takes place and there is a complete revolution. Paul says, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new" (2 Corinthians 5:17). Our past is forgiven and we have a new future to live like kings and priests unto God. We may fall and make mistakes, but we are to get up, confess our sins, live under the blood of Jesus and be blameless. John says, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1John 1:9). God will divinely take away our sins and throw it away so that we can

be blameless. The Psalmist says, "As far as the east is from the west, So far has He removed our transgressions from us" (Psalm 103:12). Isaiah says, "Come now, and let us reason together," Says the LORD, Though your sins are like scarlet, They shall be as white as snow; Though they are red like crimson, They shall be as wool" (Isaiah 1:18).

2. "He who does not backbite with his tongue, Nor does evil to his neighbor, Nor does he take up a reproach against his friend" (Psalm 15:3).
THEY EXERCISE CONTROL OF THE TONGUE

One of the hardest things to control is the

tongue. Two of the most difficult tasks of the tongue are to speak the truth and not to run down another person. If we cannot tell the truth, do not say anything. We must not pat ourselves on the back when we speak a half-truth. That can be even more dangerous than the lie itself. The tongue also finds it hard to edify— to build others up and not to run them down. Let us not speak if we cannot say anything good. One of the greatest hurts felt in churches is that which is caused by backbiting and the spreading of rumours. If we have difficulty in this area, we need to be born again. Be filled with the Holy Spirit and live with a heavenly vision.

3. "In whose eyes a vile person is despised, But he honors those who

### fear the LORD" (Psalm 15:4a). THEY ARE DISCRIMINATING IN THEIR ASSOCIATIONS

The vile are those who do not tell the truth, slander others, do not keep their promises, make money illicitly and whose ends justify their means. Avoid the vile man and do not make them our best friends or partners. If we need a partner or someone to confide in, find someone of the same faith. The Bible says, "Do not be unequally yoked together with unbelievers. For what fellowship has righteousness with lawlessness? And what communion has light with darkness?" (2 Corinthians 6:14). But that does not mean that we cannot be friendly to sinners. We need to be a witness or a testimony to potential believers.

4. "...who keeps his oath even when it hurts" (Psalm 15:4b, NIV).

#### THEY ARE FAITHFUL TO COMMITMENTS

Faithfulness is never tested only when all goes well. But when things go wrong, will we still be faithful to God? Will we remain true to the Lord and to the Church, even if it hurts us? Joseph is a good example of one who remained faithful when tempted. Potiphar put Joseph in charge of his household and all that he owned. When Potiphar's wife made advances on him, Joseph remained faithful to his commitment to God and his master (Genesis 39:2-20). Let us be faithful even when it hurts us.

5. "He who does not put out his money at usury, Nor does he take a bribe


#### at usury, Nor does he take a bribe against the innocent" (Psalm 15:5). THEY DO NOT EXPLOIT OTHERS

Kings and priests do not cheat or seek personal gain by abusing others or the powers vested in them. Loan sharks and those who take bribes exploit the circumstances of others. Those living with a heavenly vision do not take advantage of the desperate situations or needs of others.

Heaven is a place populated by godly people who live as kings and priests on earth. Let us live with a heavenly vision. We will then live stable lives here on earth and we will be at home when we get to heaven!



Bright and early on Saturday morning, 2 May 2009, 77 business professionals of Calvary Church came to Damansara Heights to receive a wonderful combination of physical and spiritual food. 
Rev. Dikran Salbashian then shared practical ways on how we can make 'His Kingdom, Our Priority in the Marketplace' which were based on this simple, biblical premise—there is no such distinction between secular or sacred work. In the Old Testament times (Leviticus 8:10), God's people had to be careful to consider what was clean and unclean, holy and common. But when Jesus came to be the ultimate living sacrifice, He bridged that gap. Now, we are free. We can embrace the life-changing attitude of 'I'm serving God in everything I do. Everything I do is as unto God. It is sacred'.

Our citizenship must be evident from our behaviour too. As citizens of heaven, our colleagues and associates at work should feel the difference as they enter our 'work zone'. We, as Christ's ambassadors, involve God in our decision-making, commit our days into His hands and put our utmost best in serving Him as our ultimate boss. As a direct result of this, we are better workers, more productive performers and kinder bosses. Many of the attendees had workplace-related questions which were well-addressed by Rev. Dikran. rom 1 to 4 June 2009, the campers travelled to the Swiss Family Garden Resort, Lumut, for our annual Family Camp. Despite the hot weather, the Calvarites, and their friends and families were determined to receive a touch from God and to have an enjoyable time.

Senior Pastor Prince Guneratnam delivered the keynote address on the first night basing his message on the call of the prophet Jeremiah. Known as 'the weeping prophet', Jeremiah frequently focussed on what he could not do till he had an encounter with Christ and "found the Word." Senior Pastor encouraged us to desire intimacy with God above all else. This made all the difference for Jeremiah and turned him into a passionate proclaimer of God's Word.

Our Camp speaker, Rev. Dikran Salbashian, who was accompanied by his wife Ani, is well known to us. For all mornings, campers were exhorted to find our true purpose in life in order to find fulfilment. With characteristic humour, he said that everything in life has a purpose and an original intent which can be found in the mind of the "Manufacturer" and written in the "Manual". Not knowing the proper purpose of a thing often leads to abuse. On Wednesday, he showed us from the book of Genesis that God's original intent for man was that he should "be

fruitful, multiply, fill and subdue the earth." This is the intent of God for the church today too. Whenever man, either in the Old Testament record or the church of Acts deflected from his purpose, God intervened to scatter the people. Finally, Rev. Dikran inspired the campers to recognise ourselves as ambassadors representing heaven on earth. This meant recognising our place of authority, dignity and responsibility.

In the night sessions, Rev. Dikran dealt with the topic of handling worry and of the importance of making the right choices. Many campers were ministered to while praying at the altars. Rev. Dikran and Ani shared candidly in workshops for married campers on Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon, while Associate Pastors Steven Kum and David Seah talked to the singles on building relationships.

During the hot afternoons, campers cooled off in the swimming pool and sea or played hilarious games of telematch. There were golf tournaments and some campers took a trip to Pulau Pangkor or drove to nearby towns to sample the local fare. It was a blessed time of fun, fellowship and Godly instruction. In the end, although there was some reluctance, as there usually is, to end an enjoyable holiday, campers left for home charged with the desire to impact our surroundings as ambassadors for Christ. +

# AT "LAVA LAVA ISLAND By Jeannie Low WHERE JESUS' LOVE FLOWS'

n 1 to 4 June 2009, simultaneously with our Church Family Camp, the children had their own "Lava Lava Island" Kids Camp programme. For the seven to 13 age group, there were three Bible Points that were emphasised through various teaching approaches: Jesus brings hope; Jesus followed God's Word; and Jesus gives us courage.

On the second night of camp, the children were privileged to hear Sister Ani Salbashian (Pastor Dikran's wife) share God's Word. She shared from the parable "The woman with the lost coin" and told the children about how precious and special each one of them is in the sight of God.

On Wednesday night, we praise the Lord for many of the children who responded to reaffirm their love and commitment to Jesus. Among the highlights of the Kids Camp were fun, interactive games and Tribal Dynamics (Tribe Cheer, Tribe Flag, etc) sessions that served to encourage co-operation among children of the same small group (called a tribe), and also a bonfire fellowship that was held on the last night of camp.

The younger children (nursery to six years old) learnt about five Bible Points through various means of teaching, activities and games. In addition to the above-mentioned Bible Points, they emphasised: Jesus saves us and Jesus gives us a reason to celebrate.

Lalu aku mendengar suara yang nyaring dari takhta itu berkata: "Lihatlah, kemah TUHAN ada di tengah-tengah manusia dan la akan diam bersama-sama dengan mereka. Mereka akan menjadi umat-Nya dan la akan menjadi TUHAN mereka. Dan la akan menghapus segala air mata dari mata mereka, dan maut tidak akan ada lagi; tidak akan ada lagi perkabungan, atau ratap tangis, atau dukacita, sebab segala sesuatu yang lama itu telah berlalu" (Wahyu 21: 1-4). "Dan malam tidak akan ada lagi di sana, dan mereka tidak memerlukan cahaya lampu dan cahaya matahari, sebab TUHAN akan menerangi mereka, dan mereka akan memerintah sebagai raja sampai selama-lamanya" (Wahyu 22:5). Tambahan pula, kemuliaan Yerusalem

Baru (Wahyu 21: 9-21) ditunjukkan kepada Yohanes.

Yohanes seterusnya berkata, "Dan aku tidak melihat Bait Suci di dalamnya; sebab TUHAN, Tuhan Yang Mahakuasa, adalah Bait Sucinya, demikian juga Anak Domba itu. Dan kota itu tidak memerlukan matahari dan bulan untuk menyinarinya, sebab kemuliaan TUHAN meneranginya dan Anak Domba itu adalah lampunya. Dan bangsa-bangsa akan berjalan di dalam cahayanya dan raja-raja di bumi membawa kekayaan mereka kepadanya; dan pintu-pintu gerbangnya tidak akan ditutup pada siang hari, sebab malam tidak akan ada lagi di sana; dan kekayaan dan hormat bangsa-bangsa akan dibawa kepadanya. Tetapi tidak akan masuk ke dalamnya sesuatu yang najis, atau orang yang melakukan kekejian atau dusta, tetapi hanya mereka yang namanya tertulis di dalam kitab kehidupan Anak Domba itu" (Wahyu 21: 22-27).

Syurga itu nyata, indah dan tempat yang sempurna. Tetapi siapa yang mungkin pergi ke sana? Hanya dua tempat, seseorang boleh pergi selepas kematian iaitu syurga atau neraka. Raja Daud bertanya, "TUHAN, siapa yang boleh menumpang dalam kemah-Mu? Siapa yang boleh diam di gunung-Mu yang kudus?" (Mazmur 15:1). Dalam erti kata lain, "Siapa yang akan pergi ke syurga? Siapa yang akan tinggal bersama di mana kamu akan tinggal?" Ini merupakan soalan-soalan yang penting dan berkaitan.

Sebagai anak Tuhan yang ingin pergi

ke syurga, kita patut hidup di atas bumi seperti hidup di syurga. Anak-anak daripada keluarga diraja adalah dilatih untuk hidup sebagai raja dan ratu sejak dilahirkan. Mereka tidak menunggu sehingga mereka dinobatkan sebelum mereka hidup seperti orang diraja. Mereka dididik sejak kecil lagi supaya apabila tiba masanya untuk mereka menjadi raja, ia akan menjadi kenaikan yang semulajadi. Ini juga benar kepada orang percaya. Tuhan mahu kita hidup seperti anak-anak kepada Tuhan Maha Tinggi. Kita telah diselamatkan, disucikan dan dipanggil untuk hidup sebagai raja dan imam. Yohanes berkata, "...Bagi Dia, yang mengasihi kita dan yang telah melepaskan kita dari dosa kita oleh darah-Nya dan yang telah membuat kita menjadi suatu kerajaan, menjadi imam-imam bagi TUHAN, Bapa-Nya, bagi Dialah kemuliaan dan kuasa sampai selama-lamanya. Amin" (Wahyu 1: 5-6).

Tuhan sedang dalam proses mendidik dan melatih kita dengan Firman Tuhan supaya kita boleh hidup seperti raja dan imam. Apabila sudah tiba masanya untuk kita pergi ke syurga, kita akan dengan selesa terus menjadi raja dan imam kepada Tuhan. Kita mesti memeriksa kalender dan temujanji kita. Adakah aktiviti-aktviti kita mencerminkan kasih kita kepada Tuhan dan keinginan kita untuk hidup sebagai raja dan imam kerana Dia yang telah memanggil kita? Jika kita benar mengasihi Tuhan dan hidup dengan visi syurga, kita akan meluangkan waktu bagi Tuhan dalam hidup kita dan kerajaanNya akan menjadi keutamaan kita.

#### senior pastor's message

Dalam Mazmur 15, Raja Daud memberikan kita sifat-sifat bagi raja dan imam yang "berdiam dalam bait Tuhan dan hidup di gunungNya yang kudus" sebagai warganegara syurga:

1. "Yaitu dia yang berlaku tidak bercela, yang melakukan apa yang adil dan yang mengatakan kebenaran dengan segenap hatinya" (Mazmur 15:2).

#### MEREKA YANG TIDAK BERCELA

Menjadi tidak bercela bermaksud hidup kehidupan yang bersesuaian dengan undang-undang moral Tuhan dengan kejujuran sepenuhnya dan dengan tiada dosa tersembunyi. Ia bukan bakat, karisma, pelajaran atau kekayaan yang menjadikan kita tidak bercela. Hanya darah Yesus mampu membuat kita tidak bercela. Yohanes berkata. "Karena begitu besar kasih TUHAN akan dunia ini, sehingga la telah mengaruniakan Anak-Nya yang tunggal, supaya setiap orang yang percaya kepada-Nya tidak binasa, melainkan beroleh hidup yang kekal. Sebab TUHAN mengutus Anak-Nya ke dalam dunia bukan untuk menghakimi dunia, melainkan untuk menyelamatkannya oleh Dia. Barangsiapa percaya kepada-Nya, ia tidak akan dihukum; barangsiapa tidak percaya, ia telah berada di bawah hukuman, sebab ia tidak percaya dalam nama Anak Tunggal TUHAN" (Yohanes 3: 16-18). Tuhan melihat kita sebagai murni, bersih dan diterima kerana Yesus Kristus darahNya. Itulah sebabnya Al-kitab berkata, "Demikianlah sekarang tidak ada penghukuman bagi mereka yang ada di dalam Kristus Yesus. Roh, yang memberi hidup telah memerdekakan kamu dalam Kristus dari hukum dosa dan hukum maut" (Roma 8: 1-2).

Apabila kita menerima Kristus, satu kelahiran baru terjadi dan di sana ada revolusi yang lengkap. Paulus berkata, "Jadi siapa yang ada di dalam Kristus, ia adalah ciptaan baru: yang lama sudah berlalu, sesungguhnya yang baru sudah datang" (2 Korintus 5:17). Masa lampau kita telah diampuni dan kita ada masa depan baru untuk hidup seperti raja dan imam kepada Tuhan. Kita mungkin jatuh dan membuat kesalahan, tetapi kita patut bangun, mengaku dosa kita, hidup di bawah darah Yesus dan

menjadi tidak bercela. Yohanes berkata, "Jika kita mengaku dosa kita, maka la adalah setia dan adil, sehingga la akan mengampuni segala dosa kita dan menyucikan kita dari segala kejahatan" (1 Yohanes 1:9). Tuhan dengan keilahian Nya akan mengambil dosa dan membuangnya supaya kita menjadi tidak bercela. Pemazmur berkata, "sejauh timur dari barat, demikian dijauhkan-Nya dari pada kita pelanggaran kita" (Mazmur 103:12). Yesaya berkata, "Marilah, baiklah kita berperkara! --firman TUHAN--Sekalipun dosamu merah seperti kirmizi, akan menjadi putih seperti salju; sekalipun berwarna merah seperti kain kesumba, akan menjadi putih seperti bulu domba" (Yesaya 1:18).

2. "Yaitu dia yang tidak menyebarkan fitnah dengan lidahnya, yang tidak berbuat jahat terhadap temannya dan yang tidak menimpakan cela kepada tetangganya" (Mazmur 15:3).

#### MEREKA YANG MENGAWAL LIDAH

Salah satu perkara yang paling sukar dikawal ialah lidah. Dua tugas lidah yang paling sukar ialah bercakap benar dan tidak menjatuhkan orang lain. Jika kita tidak boleh bercakap benar, janganlah bercakap apa-apa. Kita tidak sepatutnya memuji diri kita apabila kita tidak bercakap benar sepenuhnya. Itu sebenarnya lebih bahaya daripada penipuan itu sendiri. Lidah juga sukar untuk membangun-mendorong orang lain dan tidak menjatuhkan mereka. Marilah kita berdiam jika kita tidak mempunyai apaapa yang baik untuk dikatakan. Salah satu kesakitan yang terbesar dialami di dalam gereja adalah pemfitnahan dan penyebaran kabar angin. Jika kita mempunyai kesukaran dalam aspek ini, kita perlulah dilahirkan kembali. Dipenuhilah dengan Roh Kudus dan hidup dengan visi syurga.

3. "Yaitu dia yang memandang hina orang yang tersingkir, tetapi memuliakan orang yang takut akan TUHAN" (Mazmur 15:4a).

#### MEREKA MENDISKRIMINASI DALAM PERSEKUTUAN MEREKA

Yang hina ialah mereka yang tidak berkata benar, menfitnah orang lain, tidak menepati janji, mendapat wang dengan cara haram dan pada akhirnya memberi alasan untuk cara buruk mereka. Elakkan orang yang hina dan janganlah menjadikan mereka sebagai sahabat karib atau pasangan kita. Jika kita memerlukan kawan atau seseorang untuk memberitahu rahsia, carilah seseorang yang seiman. Alkitab berkata, "Janganlah kamu merupakan pasangan yang tidak seimbang dengan orang-orang yang tak percaya. Sebab persamaan apakah terdapat antara kebenaran dan kedurhakaan? Atau bagaimanakah terang dapat bersatu dengan gelap?" (2 Korintus 6:14). Tetapi itu tidak bermakna kita tidak boleh berkawan dengan orang berdosa. Kita perlu bersaksi atau menjadi kesaksian kepada orang bukan Kristian.

4. Yaitu dia yang berpegang pada sumpah, walaupun rugi" (Mazmur 15:4b). MEREKA SETIA DALAM KOMITMEN

Keimanan tidak akan diuji apabila semua berjalan dengan baik. Tetapi apabila sesuatu yang tidak baik berlaku, adakah kita masih beriman kepada Tuhan? Adakah kita masih tetap benar kepada Tuhan dan Gereja, walaupun ia menyakiti kita? Yusuf ialah contoh baik seseorang yang tetap beriman apabila digoda. Potifar meletakkan Yusuf untuk menjaga keluarganya dan semua yang dimilikinya. Apabila isteri Potifar mengoda dia, Yusuf tetap dengan komitmennya kepada Tuhan dan tuannya (Kejadian 39:2-20). Marilah kita beriman walaupun ia mungkin menyakiti kita.

5. "Yaitu dia yang tidak meminjamkan uangnya dengan makan riba dan tidak menerima suap melawan orang yang tak bersalah. Siapa yang berlaku demikian, tidak akan goyah selama-lamanya" (Mazmur 15:5).

#### MEREKA TIDAK

#### MENGEKSPLOITASIKAN ORANG LAIN

Raja dan imam tidak akan menipu atau mencari keuntungan sendiri dengan menyalahgunakan kuasa yang diamanahkan kepada mereka. Lintah darat dan mereka yang mengambil rasuah mengeksploitasikan situasi orang lain. Mereka yang hidup dengan visi syurga tidak akan mengambil kesempatan di atas keadaan terdesak atau keperluan orang lain.

Syurga ialah tempat kediaman orang yang beriman yang hidup sebagai raja dan imam di atas bumi. Marilah kita hidup dalam suatu visi syurga. Kita kemudiannya akan hidup dengan stabil di atas bumi dan akan berasa selesa bagaikan rumah apabila kita sampai di syurga!

#### senior pastor's message



我们愈想像天堂,我们愈被激励以神的方式活出基督徒的生活。我们对天堂的知识和确信不足。这就是为什么许多的基督徒过着属世肉体的生活。天堂是真实的吗?天堂是怎么样的地方?

使徒约翰给了我们一个关于天堂的看 见。他说:「我又看见一个新天新地。 因为先前的天地已经过去了,海也不再 有了。我又看见圣城新耶路撒冷由神那 里从天而降,预备好了,就如新妇妆饰整 齐,等候丈夫。我听见有大声音从宝座出 来说: "看哪!神的帐幕在人间。他要与 人同住,他们要作他的子民;神要亲自与他 们同在,作他们的神。神要擦去他们一切 的眼泪。不再有死亡,也不再有悲哀、哭 号、疼痛,因为以前的事都过去了。" (启21:1~4)。「不再有黑夜,他们也不用 灯光、日光,因为主神要光照他们。他 们要作王,直到永永远远」(启22:5)。此 外,新耶路撒冷的荣耀也启示了给约翰(启 21:9~21)。

约翰接着说:「我未见城内有殿,因主神全能者和羔羊为城的殿。那城内又不用日月光照,因有神的荣耀光照,又有羔羊为城的灯。列国要在城的光里行走,地上的君王必将自己的荣耀归与那城。城门白昼总不关闭,在那里原没有黑夜。人必将列国的荣耀、尊贵归与那城。凡不洁净

的,并那行可憎与虚谎之事的,总不得进那城;只有名字写在羔羊生命册上的才得进去。」(启21:22~27)。

天堂是真实的,美丽和完全的地方。但是谁能去那里呢?人在死后能去的只有两个地方。大卫王问道:「耶和华啊,谁能寄居你的帐幕?谁能住在你的圣山?」(诗15:1)换句话说,「谁能去天堂?谁能居住在神所在的地方?」这些都是有关联的问题。

作为神的儿女,要想去天堂的人,我们应该住在地上如同将会住在天堂一样。王室的子女都生来被教养以王族方式生活。他们没有等到他们被加冕时才以王族方式生活。他们从年幼就受过训练以便在他们为王的时候,这是自然的进展。这对信徒来说也是如此。神要我们以至高神的儿女身份生活。我们已被救赎,洁净和呼召以君尊祭司的身份生活。约翰说:「…他爱我们,用自己的血使我们脱离罪恶,又使我们成为国民,作他父神的祭司。但愿荣耀、权能归给他,直到永永远远。阿们!」(启1:5~6)。

神正在以神的道来造就和训练我们的进程中,以便我们能有作君尊和祭司的生活。当我们去天堂的时候到了,我们可以坦然的在神面前作君尊和祭司的生活。我们必须检查我们的日程表和约会。我们的活动到底有没有反映我们对神的爱和我们渴望过一个蒙呼召作君尊和祭司的生活?如果我们真正的爱神和以属天的异象生活,我们会在我们的生活里有与神相处的时间,并以他的国为我们生活的优先。

在诗篇15篇,大卫王给了我们以下作君 王和祭司的特征,即"居住在神的会幕中 和他的圣山上"作为天国子民的人: 1.「就是行为正直、做事公义、心里说实 话的人」(诗15:2)。

他们是正直的人。作为正直的人是指活出一个与神道德律一致的生活,完全诚恳和没有隐藏的罪。不是我们的才能,魅力,学历或财富使我们成为正直的人。唯有耶稣的宝血使我们成为正直的人。约翰说:「神爱世人,甚至将他的独生子赐给他们,叫一切信他的,不至灭亡,反得永生。因为神差他的儿子降世,不是要定世人的罪,乃是要叫世人因他得救。信他的人,不被定罪;不信的人,罪已经定了,因为他不信神独生子的名」(约3:16~18)。神看我们为纯洁,洁净和蒙接纳是因为耶稣基督和他的宝血。这是为何圣经说:「如今,那些在基督耶稣里的就不定罪了,即不随从肉体,只随从圣灵的人」(罗8:1)。

当我们接受基督,经历重生和完全的改革。保罗说:「若有人在基督里,他就是新造的人,旧事已过,都变成新的了」(林后5:17)。我们的过去得到赦免,我们有一

个新的将来,作君王和祭司为神而活。我们也许会跌倒和犯错误,但是我们要站起来,承认我们的罪,在耶稣宝血遮盖下生活和作正直的人。约翰说:「我们若认自己的罪,神是信实的,是公义的,必要赦免我们的罪,洗净我们一切的不义」(约壹1:9)。神会神圣地把我们的罪除去以致我们能够成为正直的人。诗人说:「东离西有多远,他叫我们的过犯离我们也有多远」(诗103:12)。以赛亚说:「耶和华说:"你们来,我们彼此辩论。你们的罪虽像朱红,必变成雪白;虽红如丹颜,必白如羊毛」(赛1:18)。

2.「他不以舌头谗谤人,不恶待朋友,也不 随伙毁谤邻里」(诗15:3)。

他们操练控制他们的舌头。最难控制的事情之一就是控制舌头。舌头最艰难的两个任务就是讲真话和不诽谤他人。如果我们不能够讲实话,就不要说什么。当我们的陈述是半真半假时,我们绝不能沾沾自喜。它比谎言本身更加危险。舌头也难以造就人——造就他人,而不是贬低他人。让我们不要说话,如果我们不能说什么好话。在教会里遭受到最大的伤害之一就是由诽谤和传播谣言所造成的伤害。如果我们在这方面有困难,我们需要经历重生。被圣灵充满和以属天的异象生活。

3.「他眼中藐视匪类,却尊重那敬畏耶和华的人。」(诗15:4上)。

他们分清所交往的人。匪类是那些不说实话,诽谤他人,不守信用,非法赚钱的人和他们在追求目的,可以不择手段。避开这些匪类的人,不要与他们深交或作伙伴。如果我们需要伙伴或可倾诉的人,要找一个相同信仰的人。圣经上说:「你们和不信的原不相配,不要同负一轭。义和不义有什么相交呢?光明和黑暗有什么相通呢?」(林后6:14)。但那并不是指我们不可与罪人来往。我们需要成为非信徒的见证人或对他们有好见证。

4.「...他发了誓,虽然自己吃亏,也不更改」(诗15:4下)。

他们是信守诺言的人。在一切事情都顺利时,忠信是从来没有受到试验的。但是当面对问题时,我们是否仍然忠信于神呢?我们是否继续忠心于主和教会,即使是我们受损?约瑟是一个在遭受试探时仍然忠心的好榜样。波提乏派约瑟管理家务和他一切所有的。当波提乏的妻子向他献殷勤时,约瑟仍然是忠心于他对神和他的主人作出的承诺(创39:2~40)。让我们继续忠心即使是我们受损。

5.「他不放债取利,不受贿赂以害无辜。行 这些事的人必永不动摇。」(诗15:5) 他们不剥削他人。君王和祭司是不欺诈或



# KINGDOM RELATIONSHIPS IN THE CHURCH By Carol Weller





awrence Theodore (LT) Jeyachandran, the speaker of the School of Christian Growth Open Session held on 16 and 17 April 2009, is the Executive Director of Ravi Zacharias International Ministries (Asia Pacific) and is a well known Bible expositor, knowledgeable in Hebrew and Greek.

LT began his session on Thursday by emphasising that Christianity is not about principles but is the connecting of each believer's 'story' to the historical narrative of the life of Jesus and the transformation that should take place as a result of that relationship. The Trinity is all about relationship and we are created in His image (Genesis 1:26-27). The Three in the Godhead are forever in loving relationship to one another, all being equal but subject to one another in their different roles just as we the church should be (1 Corinthians 11:3).

With humour and scholastic detail, LT brought clarity to three concepts i.e. that of love, trust and freedom. He explained that trust and freedom are expressions of love. Freedom is not the ability to do just anything we want, but rather a relational quality where we as a body of Christ give each other freedom to be ourselves while allowing the other permission to invade our 'space'. True identity does not derive from our jobs or gifting but our relationship with God. Having a proper identity frees us to be relational to one another. We, as a church must recognise that unity as a body is of paramount importance to God, as seen in Jesus' prayer in John 17:20-23. God ministers to us through other believers and we are accountable to one another. We will be judged one day on how much we love one another.

On Friday, LT traced the development of Jesus' new commandment to love. In Mosaic Law we were told to love one another as we loved ourselves. Jesus raised the standard in John 13:34-35 where we are to love as Jesus loves us and in John 15-as the Father has loved the Son. In John 13 where Jesus washes the feet of the disciples, we as church are given authority to 'wash each other's feet'. We are called to be an interdependent, giving and receiving community. We are to reflect God's love in our Life Groups, families and relationships with one another. By this will the world know that we belong to Christ.

Jesus, though being equal with the Father, committed His spirit into the Father's hands (Luke 23:46). He submitted himself to the Father's will to raise Him up even while He had power to raise Himself. In relationships where we can teach and correct one another lovingly, we are "like two imperfect people in perfect relationship".

At the end of these sessions, we were enriched indeed in our understanding of Kingdom relationships. +





n 2 May 2009, Calvary Youth organised a seminar entitled "Preparing Spiritually for College Life" which was conducted by Rosemarie Kowalski, of Northwest University, USA. We had an attendance of 132 which consisted of our young people, parents and people who work with youth.

The speaker rightfully stressed the importance of knowing our identity in Christ as the foundation as we enter into a period of life where identities are shaped from without and within. The seminar itself consisted of three sessions in which the starting point, the journey and the destination of college life were respectively addressed.

Rosemarie said that going to college was a chance to re-invent ourselves. The little decisions we make during our period of time in college will ultimately shape our being in adulthood. 


