he Prayer Emphasis Week from 5 to 11 July 2009 saw Life Groups praying together as they met from Monday to Thursday, Calvarites praying at the Wednesday Morning Watch at 7am at Damansara Heights and at the Prayer Meetings at all the Church locations on Friday at 8pm.

A Children's Prayer Meeting was held simultaneously on Friday night with the theme, "God Hears." The children were encouraged to know God hears the prayers from their hearts and applied what they learnt by praying in small groups. the many great testimonies received of God's provision of direction and finances, strengthening of relationships, greater self-control, help with studies, favour with business deals and increased discipline in setting aside time to pray, from those who paused and prayed, seeking to do the will of the Most High God. •

he fathers who attended our Worship Services on Father's Day, 21 June 2009, were acknowledged, appreciated and prayed for by Senior Pastor Prince Guneratnam and the respective Associate Pastors at the various Church locations. We were privileged to have our Honorary Pastor, Rev. Dr. Delmer Guynes, whom we consider a father of Calvary Church, to give us the Father's Day message. His son, Del Ray spoke at Damansara Perdana and at the 5pm Worship Service at Damansara Heights.

"Fatherhood," said Pastor Guynes, "is a divine characteristic." God desires to be a Father to us whom He created in His image and for us to know that He is a loving, kind and concerned Father. He gave us Jesus so that that those who believe in Him will not perish but have everlasting life (John 3:16). Jesus restored God's fatherhood to those who lost their relationship with the Father. Pastor Guynes spoke of the great love of the father in the account of the prodigal son. Similarly, God our Father loves us regardless of what we have done and seeks our return to Him. The fathers present were urged to do the same with their children and to make it a priority to ensure that they have a right relationship with the heavenly Father.

We were greatly encouraged to be reminded that we are co-heirs with Jesus because God has given us the Spirit of adoption (Romans 8). We also have a faithful heavenly Father who has made "great and precious promises" to us which He will keep (1 Peter 1:4). Fathers need to follow God's example and keep their promises and commitments to their children.

Our heavenly Father disciplines us whom He loves (Hebrews 12:3-17) for our own good. Earthly fathers too, must discipline their children lovingly for their benefit. And finally, Pastor Guynes said that we can rejoice because our Father has prepared for us a Kingdom.

Ephesians 6:2 calls us to honour our earthly fathers and mothers. Let us also honour our heavenly Father by living our lives in such a manner that we will not be ashamed when Jesus presents us to Him! +

OUR HEAVENLY FATHER, THE GIVER

n Father's Day, 21 June 2009, Del Ray Guynes, son of Rev. Dr Delmer Guynes shared a message entitled "Our Heavenly Father who is the Giver" at Damansara Perdana and at the 5pm Worship Service at Damansara Heights.

He began by quoting from James 1:17 in which states that every good gift is from our Father above. These gifts are divided into two categories: one in which the gifts require no responsibilities except for the simple act of acceptance on our part, such as the gift of salvation, the Holy Spirit and access to the Father; and the other which demands our stewardship.


Using the Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25:14-30) as an illustration, Del Ray drew an analogy where the master in the story was God and the three servants were us believers. Although we all want to be like the first two servants who pleased their master, we often feel like the third servant. His attitude towards his role as a steward arose because he had erroneous views, both of himself and his master. Firstly, he presumed his master was a hard man and concluded in his heart that his opinion was right (Matthew 25:24), and secondly, he was afraid of failure and prioritised his fear for personal loss over his master's agenda. Finally, he was not willing to work diligently to be productive for his master.

How then do we get beyond being a "one-talent" servant as depicted in the Scriptures? Firstly, we would have to change our earthly perspectives of God being a "hard man" by spending time with Him as our Heavenly Father with the Holy Spirit guiding us. Secondly, we need to realise and be aware that everything we have is a gift from God and we are accountable to Him. As we are accountable, we will take greater care over the things He blesses us with. Thirdly,

we need to focus on the opportunities given by God specifically and uniquely to us as individuals—not everyone will have the same talents. We need to guard our hearts from professional jealousy and bitterness that results from our thinking that our talents are inferior to others'. Fourthly, we need to deal with our fear of failure by having confidence in God who gave us our talents in the first place. Sometimes we can be afraid of success as well. With success comes responsibility and sometimes we shun responsibilities, but we need to do away with that kind of thinking, knowing that God has the best in mind for us. Last but not least, we need to get busy! Sometimes we may feel or give the excuse that we are unprepared or unequipped to do His work, but the fact is, we will never feel we know the Lord adequately enough to do His work. We simply have to trust Him to equip us for His work though we have not known Him as much as we would like to (Phillipians 3:12).

In conclusion, Del Ray exhorted us to live as more than simple servants but as children of our Father who is the Giver, doing and giving our best to please Him. God is more than a dutiful Master over His household. He is our gracious Heavenly Father who withholds no good gifts from us. •





herefore let us leave the elementary teachings about Christ and go on to maturity, not laying again the foundation of repentance from acts that lead to death, and of faith in God" (Hebrews 6:1).

There is more to being a Christian than receiving Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour, being baptised in water and in the Holy Spirit, with the evidence of speaking in tongues. In fact, those are vital steps of becoming what Christ wants us to be. God fills us with the Holy Spirit because He knows that we need His empowerment for the new nature we have in Christ to mature spiritually.

To be spiritually matured or more like Jesus, is the reason God sent Jesus to be our Saviour. The Church is the body of Christ, redeemed by the Blood of the Lamb. Sadly, there are those who treat churches only as kindergartens and not also of schools of higher learning in the ways of God, entertainment houses instead of places of ministry, fashion houses instead of houses of passion for souls. Some who attend church are 'players' instead of 'prayers'! When a church is carnal instead of spiritual, it is no wonder that Paul says, "Brothers, I could not address you as spiritual

but as worldly—mere infants in Christ" (1 Corinthians 3:1).

God is calling His Church to be matured and be conformed to the image of Jesus Christ. We must be weaned from milk, learn to chew meat and grow up not just grow older in age. The Bible says, "We have much to say about this, but it is hard to explain because you are slow to learn. In fact, though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you the elementary truths of God's word all over again. You need milk, not solid food! Anyone who lives on milk, being still an infant, is not acquainted with the teaching about righteousness. But solid food is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil" (Hebrews 5:11-14).

James gives us some marks of immaturity:

1. IMPATIENCE, ESPECIALLY IN THE FACE OF DIFFICULTIES, OPPOSITION AND ADVERSE CIRCUMSTANCES.

James says, "Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance. Perseverance must finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything" (James 1:2-4).

2. ALL TALK AND NO ACTION.

James says, "What good is it, my brothers, if a man claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save him?" (James 2:14). The ability to speak and articulate well about our faith is not a sign of maturity. Maturity is indicated only when what we know and profess is translated into actions that lead to transformed and changed lives. John says, "Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth" (1 John 3:18).

3. UNTAMED TONGUE.

James says, "All kinds of animals, birds, reptiles and creatures of the sea are being tamed and have been tamed by man, but no man can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. With the tongue we praise our Lord and Father, and with it we curse men, who have been made in God's likeness. Out of the same mouth come praise and cursing. My brothers, this should not be" (James 3:7-10). The immature has no control of the tongue.

4. FIGHTING, DIVISION AND STRIFE.

James says, "What causes fights and quarrels among you? Don't they come from your desires that battle within

you? You want something but don't get it. You kill and covet, but you cannot have what you want. You quarrel and fight. You do not have, because you do not ask God. When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures" (James 4:1-3). James teaches that fighting and bickering amongst believers are harmful and reflect their immaturity.

5. WORLDLINESS OR MATERIALISM. James says, "Now listen, you rich people, weep and wail because of the misery that is coming upon you. Your wealth has rotted, and moths have eaten your clothes. Your gold and silver are corroded. Their corrosion will testify against you and eat your flesh like fire. You have hoarded wealth in the last days. Look! The wages you failed to pay the workmen who mowed your fields are crying out against you. The cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord Almighty. You have lived on earth in luxury and self-indulgence. You have fattened yourselves in the day of slaughter. You have condemned and murdered innocent men, who were not opposing you" (James 5:1-6). James warns rich oppressors against the perils of selfindulgence and adopting materialistic standards which reflect an immature mentality.

We have to grow up and growing up is different from growing old. Maturity is not determined by age. When God saved us, His salvation was perfect. We are called to build on that perfect salvation that God has brought into our lives. Just as a child has two parents to bring them up in a balanced manner, spiritually, we have the Word and the Spirit of God to help us mature in Christ. We need both the Word and the Spirit in our daily living. Jesus said to Nicodemus, "I tell you the truth, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless he is born of water and the Spirit. Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit" (John 3:5-6). The Word of God brings life and the Spirit of God gives guidance and power to live that life. The Word brings faith and the

Spirit anoints. We are to walk or live by the Word and be empowered by the Spirit in order to become spiritual.

Paul likens the intensity of his desire for the Church to be mature in Christ to a pregnant woman's travail at childbirth. He says, "My dear children, for whom I am again in the pains of childbirth until Christ is formed in you…" (Galatians

4:19). While the woman experiences the greatest pain at childbirth, it is also the most glorious moment of her life when she finally sees her baby that is born. Pain and glory seems to be the passageway to real life and living. Spiritual maturity in Christ is a process and does not happen instantly. Just like in childbirth, it involves travail, hard work and suffering.

What steps can we take to spiritual maturity in the face of suffering?

James tells us:

1. "Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds" (James 1:2).

HAVE A JOYFUL ATTITUDE.

Our attitude will determine our actions. We must not allow difficult circumstances or situations to rob us of our joy. Yes, our flesh may flinch at the pain but the Holy Spirit will help us through. We can say as the Lord Almighty says, "Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit" (Zechariah 4:6). The joy of the Lord is our strength (Nehemiah 8:10) and not our intelligence, our capabilities or talents. By God's grace and strength, we can rejoice in suffering.

2. "If any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to him" (James 1:5).

DEPEND ON OUR RENEWED

MINDS WHICH WE RECEIVED WHEN WE WERE SAVED, ASKING GOD FOR WISDOM. We must not depend on our natural minds which the Bible calls reprobate (Romans 1:28, KJV)–foolish and immature. Instead, we are to depend on the teaching from the Word of God. 3. "Blessed is the man who

perseveres under trial, because when he has stood the test, he will receive the crown of life that God

has promised to those who love him" (James 1:12).

SURRENDER OUR WILL BECAUSE OF OUR LOVE FOR GOD.

Jesus prayed to the Father at Gethsemane, "Take this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will" (Mark 14:35). Jesus persevered and fulfilled the will of the Father.


4. "Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says" (James 1:22).

PRACTISE WHAT WE HEAR.

Knowledge gained through education and attending church, seminars and conferences alone does not make us mature. We become mature only when we translate what we learn into action. The key to maturity is walking in obedience to God's Word. Knowing does not equate to doing.

God is calling us to be matured in Him and not merely grow older but grow up to be more and more like Jesus. Let us live by the Word of God which brings faith and allow the Holy Spirit to anoint and empower us to be spiritually matured so that we can say like Paul, "When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put childish ways behind me" (1 Corinthians 13:10-11)




CALVARY CARNIVAL '09 UPDATE By Jason Sia

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

In keeping with the missions theme of the second half of the year – "Declare His glory among the nations", our own Missionary Pooshani, who was back on home assignment, gave us an uplifting pictorial praise report of the many salvations, new cells, new leaders raised and other growth that had taken place in Harvesters Assembly in Yei, Sudan.

Missions worker, Carol Weller then introduced the "Parade of Nations" which was a presentation by Calvarites representing ten different nations and regions. Dressed in colourful national costumes they gave thanks for missions work done by Calvary Church in these different nations throughout the years and presented prayer requests for the congregation to pray.





Our Missions speaker was none other than our Honorary Pastor, Rev. Dr Delmer Guynes. He inspired us with his message on "The Keys of the Kingdom" based on Matthew 16:13-19. We have been entrusted with keys to open the locks that imprison people in slavery to the strategies and powers of the enemy. 




CARPENTER'S WORKSHOP KIDS RENEW THEIR FAITH PROMISES

Seeing members grow and begin to commit themselves to ministry is an enriching experience. Three of my members are now leaders themselves. Recently, I was very encouraged when my LG members responded to assist with some painting work at Calvaryland. They found it fulfilling to be able to do something meaningful for the glory of God.

ebab itu marilah kita tinggalkan asas-asas pertama dari ajaran tentang Kristus dan beralih kepada perkembangannya yang penuh. Janganlah kita meletakkan lagi dasar pertobatan dari perbuatan-perbuatan yang sia-sia, dan dasar kepercayaan kepada Tuhan" (lbrani 6:1).

Menjadi seorang Kristian bukan sahaja sekadar menerima Yesus Kristus sebagai Tuhan dan Juruselamat, dibaptis dalam air dan Roh Kudus, dengan bukti berbahasa Roh. Sememangnya, ini adalah langkahlangkah penting untuk menjadi apa yang Kristus ingin kita menjadi. Tuhan memenuhi kita dengan Roh Kudus kerana Dia tahu bahawa kita memerlukan kuasaNya untuk sifat baru yang kita ada dalam Kristus untuk menjadi matang secara rohani.

Untuk menjadi matang secara rohani atau menjadi lebih menyerupai Yesus, adalah sebab kenapa Tuhan menghantar Yesus menjadi Juruselamat kita. Gereja adalah tubuh Kristus, ditebus oleh Darah Domba. Apa yang menyedihkan ialah ada diantara orang yang menganggap gereja sebagai tadika dan bukannya institusi pengajian tinggi untuk mengajar cara dan jalan Tuhan, tempat hiburan dan bukannya tempat pelayanan, rumah fesyen dan bukannya rumah untuk menjangkau jiwa yang sesat. Ada yang datang ke gereja sebagai 'pemain' dan bukannya 'pendoa'! Apabila gereja bersifat duniawi dan bukannya rohani, maka tidak hairanlah Paulus berkata, "Dan aku, saudara-saudara, pada waktu itu tidak dapat berbicara dengan kamu seperti dengan manusia rohani, tetapi hanya dengan manusia duniawi, yang belum dewasa dalam Kristus" (1 Korintus 3:1).

Tuhan sedang memanggil GerejaNya untuk menjadi matang dan berubah kepada imej Yesus Kristus. Kita mesti berhenti minum susu, belajar mengunyah daging dan membesar dan bukan hanya menjadi semakin tua dari segi umur. Alkitab berkata, "Tentang hal itu banyak yang harus kami katakan, tetapi yang sukar untuk dijelaskan, karena kamu telah lamban dalam hal mendengarkan. Sebab sekalipun kamu, ditinjau dari sudut waktu, sudah seharusnya menjadi pengajar, kamu masih perlu lagi diajarkan asasasas pokok dari penyataan Tuhan, dan kamu masih memerlukan susu, bukan makanan keras. Sebab barangsiapa masih memerlukan susu ia tidak memahami ajaran tentang kebenaran, sebab ia adalah anak kecil. Tetapi makanan keras adalah untuk orang-orang dewasa, yang karena mempunyai pancaindera yang terlatih untuk membedakan yang baik dari pada yang jahat" (Ibrani 5:11-14).

Yakobus memberi kita beberapa tanda ketidakmatangan:

1. TIDAK SABAR, TERUTAMANYA APABILA MENGHADAPI KESUKARAN, TENTANGAN DAN SITUASI YANG TIDAK BAIK.

Yakobus berkata, "Saudara-saudaraku, anggaplah sebagai suatu kebahagiaan, apabila kamu jatuh ke dalam berbagaibagai pencobaan, sebab kamu tahu, bahwa ujian terhadap imanmu itu menghasilkan ketekunan. Dan biarkanlah ketekunan itu memperoleh buah yang matang, supaya kamu menjadi sempurna dan utuh dan tak kekurangan suatu apapun" (Yakobus 1:2-4).

2. BERCAKAP SAHAJA TETAPI TIADA TINDAKAN.

Yakobus berkata, "Apakah gunanya, saudara-saudaraku, jika seorang mengatakan, bahwa ia mempunyai iman, padahal ia tidak mempunyai perbuatan? Dapatkah iman itu menyelamatkan dia?" (Yakobus 2:14). Kebolehan untuk bercakap dan menyampaikan dengan baik tentang iman kita bukannya satu tanda kematangan. Kematangan ditunjukkan hanya apabila apa yang kita tahu dan katakan diterjemahkan kepada perbuatan yang membawa perubahan hidup. Yohanes berkata, "Anakanakku, marilah kita mengasihi bukan dengan perkataan atau dengan lidah,

tetapi dengan perbuatan dan dalam kebenaran" (1 Yohanes 3:18).

3. LIDAH YANG TIDAK DIJINAKKAN.

Yakobus berkata, "Semua jenis binatang liar, burung-burung, serta binatangbinatang menjalar dan binatangbinatang laut dapat dijinakkan dan telah dijinakkan oleh sifat manusia, tetapi tidak seorangpun yang berkuasa menjinakkan lidah; ia adalah sesuatu yang buas, yang tak terkuasai, dan penuh racun yang mematikan. Dengan lidah kita memuji Tuhan, Bapa kita; dan dengan lidah kita mengutuk manusia yang diciptakan menurut rupa Tuhan, dari mulut yang satu keluar berkat dan kutuk. Hal ini, saudarasaudaraku, tidak boleh demikian terjadi" (Yakobus 3:7-10). Orang yang tidak matang tidak mengawal lidahnya.

4. PERGADUHAN, PERPECAHAN DAN PERSENGKETAAN.

Yakobus berkata, "Dari manakah datangnya sengketa dan pertengkaran di antara kamu? Bukankah datangnya dari hawa nafsumu yang saling berjuang di dalam tubuhmu? Kamu mengingini sesuatu, tetapi kamu tidak memperolehnya, lalu kamu membunuh; kamu iri hati, tetapi kamu tidak mencapai tujuanmu, lalu kamu bertengkar dan kamu berkelahi. Kamu tidak memperoleh apa-apa, karena kamu tidak berdoa. Atau kamu berdoa juga, tetapi kamu tidak menerima apa-apa, karena kamu salah berdoa, sebab yang kamu minta itu hendak kamu habiskan untuk memuaskan hawa nafsumu" (Yakobus 4:1-3). Yakobus mengajar bahawa pergaduhan dan pertengkaran antara umat Kristian adalah merbahaya dan mencerminkan ketidakmatangan mereka.

5. KEDUNIAWIAAN ATAU MATERIALISMA.

Yakobus berkata, "Jadi sekarang hai kamu orang-orang kaya, menangislah dan merataplah atas sengsara yang akan menimpa kamu! Kekayaanmu sudah busuk, dan pakaianmu telah dimakan ngengat! Emas dan perakmu sudah berkarat, dan karatnya akan menjadi kesaksian terhadap kamu dan akan memakan dagingmu seperti api. Kamu telah mengumpulkan harta pada hari-hari yang sedang berakhir. Sesungguhnya telah terdengar teriakan besar, karena upah yang kamu tahan dari buruh

yang telah menuai hasil ladangmu, dan telah sampai ke telinga Tuhan semesta alam keluhan mereka yang menyabit panenmu. Dalam kemewahan kamu telah hidup dan berfoya-foya di bumi, kamu telah memuaskan hatimu sama seperti pada hari penyembelihan. Kamu telah menghukum, bahkan membunuh orang yang benar dan ia tidak dapat melawan kamu" (Yakobus 5:1-6). Yakobus memberi amaran kepada penindas yang kaya akan bahayanya menurut keinginan diri sendiri dan mengamalkan ciri-ciri kebendaan yang mencerminkan ketidakmatangan pemikiran.

Kita mesti bertumbesar dan bertumbesar adalah berbeza daripada menjadi tua. Kematangan tidak ditentukan oleh usia. Apabila Tuhan menyelamatkan kita, keselamatanNya adalah sempurna. Kita dipanggil untuk membangun di atas keselamatan sempurna yang Tuhan bawakan ke dalam kehidupan kita. Seperti seorang anak yang mempunyai ibubapa yang membesarkan mereka dengan cara yang seimbang, dari segi kerohanian pula, kita ada Firman Tuhan dan Roh Tuhan untuk membantu kita dewasa dalam Kristus. Kita memerlukan kedua-dua Firman Tuhan dan Roh Kudus dalam kehidupan seharian kita. Yesus berkata kepada Nikodemus, "Aku berkata kepadamu, sesungguhnya jika seorang tidak dilahirkan dari air dan Roh ia tidak dapat masuk ke dalam Kerajaan Tuhan. Apa yang dilahirkan dari daging, adalah daging, dan apa yang dilahirkan dari Roh, adalah roh" (Yohanes 3:5-6). Firman Tuhan memberikan kehidupan dan Roh Tuhan memberi bimbingan dan kuasa untuk menjalani kehidupan itu. Firman Tuhan memberi iman dan Roh untuk mengurapi. Kita harus berjalan atau hidup dengan Firman Tuhan dan dikuasai oleh Roh supaya kita boleh bersifat kerohanian.

Paulus menyamakan kesungguhan hasratnya untuk Gereja menjadi matang dalam Kristus, dengan seorang wanita hamil yang sedang bersalin. Dia berkata, "Hai anak-anakku, karena kamu aku menderita sakit bersalin lagi, sampai rupa Kristus menjadi nyata di dalam kamu..." (Galatia 4:19). Semasa wanita itu mengalami kesakitan yang amat sangat sewaktu bersalin, ianya juga adalah waktu yang paling indah di dalam kehidupannya

apabila dia dapat melihat bayi yang telah dilahirkannya. Kesakitan dan keindahan kelihatan seperti laluan untuk kehidupan yang sebenar. Kematangan rohani dalam Kristus adalah satu proses dan ia tidak berlaku dengan serta merta. Sama seperti

keadaan kelahiran bayi, ia juga melibatkan kerja keras dan penderitaan.

Apakah langkah-langkah yang kita boleh ambil untuk kematangan kerohanian semasa menghadapi penderitaan? Yakobus memberitahu kita:

MEMPUNYAI SIKAP BERSUKACITA. Sikap kita akan menentukan tindakan kita. Janganlah kita izinkan keadaan atau situasi yang sukar mencuri sukacita kita. Ya, kedagingan kita akan menolak kesakitan tetapi Roh Kudus akan membantu kita melaluinya. Kita boleh berkata seperti Tuhan Maha Kuasa berkata, "Bukan dengan keperkasaan dan bukan dengan kekuatan, melainkan dengan Roh-Ku" (Zakharia 4:6). Sukacita Tuhan itulah kekuatanmu (Nehemia 8:10) dan bukannya kebijaksanaan, kebolehan atau bakat-bakat kita. Dengan anugerah dan kekuatan Tuhan, kita boleh bersukacita dalam penderitaan. 2. "Tetapi apabila di antara kamu ada yang kekurangan hikmat, hendaklah ia memintakannya kepada Tuhan, yang

memberikan kepada semua orang dengan murah hati dan dengan tidak membangkit-bangkit, maka hal itu akan diberikan kepadanya" (Yakobus 1:5). BERSANDARLAH KEPADA PEMBAHARUAN PIKIRAN KITA YANG KITA TERIMA APABILA KITA

Kita tidak boleh bersandar kepada pikiran semulajadi kita, yang Alkitab katakan sebagai pemikiran yang terkutuk (Roma 1:28) – bodoh dan tidak matang.
Sebaliknya, bersandarlah kepada pengajaran daripada Firman Tuhan.

3. "Berbahagialah orang yang bertahan dalam percobaan, sebab apabila ia sudah tahan uji, ia akan menerima mahkota kehidupan yang dijanjikan Tuhan kepada barangsiapa yang mengasihi Dia" (Yakobus 1:12).

MENYERAHKAN KEHENDAK KITA KERANA KASIH KITA KEPADA TUHAN.
Yesus berdoa kepada Bapa di syurga di Getsemani, "Ambillah cawan ini daripada-Ku, tetapi janganlah apa yang Aku kehendaki, melainkan apa yang Engkau kehendaki" (Markus 14:36). Yesus bertekun dan memenuhi kehendak Bapa di syurga.

4. "Tetapi hendaklah kamu menjadi pelaku firman dan bukan hanya pendengar saja; sebab jika tidak demikian kamu menipu diri sendiri" (Yakobus 1:22).

LAKUKANLAH APA YANG KITA DENGAR. Pengetahuan yang didapati melalui pendidikan dan menhadiri gereja, seminar-seminar dan persidangan-persidangan sahaja tidak akan menjadikan kita matang. Kita menjadi matang hanya apabila kita menterjemahkan apa yang kita belajar kepada perbuatan. Kunci kepada kematangan adalah berjalan dalam ketaatan pada Firman Tuhan. Pengetahuan tidak sama dengan kelakuan.

Tuhan sedang memanggil kita untuk menjadi matang di dalamNya dan bukan sekadar membesar menjadi tua tetapi membesar menjadi lebih seperti Yesus. Biar kita hidup dengan Firman Tuhan yang memberikan iman dan membenarkan Roh Kudus untuk mengurapi dan menguasai kita untuk menjadi matang secara rohani supaya kita boleh berkata seperti Paulus, "Ketika aku kanak-kanak, aku berkata-kata seperti kanak-kanak, aku merasa seperti kanak-kanak, aku berpikir seperti kanak-kanak. Sekarang sesudah aku menjadi dewasa, aku meninggalkan sifat kanak-kanak itu" (1 Korintus 13:10-11).

成为基督徒不仅止于接受耶稣基督为生命的主和救主,受浸礼和受圣灵的洗及有说方言的证据。事实上,使我们成为基督想要的人,这些都是非常重要的步骤。神以圣灵来充满我们因为他知道我们在基督里的新性情和为灵命成熟需要他的能力。

在属灵上成熟或更像基督是神差遣耶稣来成为我们的救主的原因。教会是基督的身体,是被羔羊的宝血所买赎。可惜,有些人把教会看作是幼儿园,而不是在神的真道上得造就的学府;是娱乐场所而不是事奉的地方;是时装商店而不是关爱灵魂的家。一些去教会的人不过是凑凑热闹而不是祷告者!当教会是属肉体而不是属灵时,难怪保罗说道:「弟兄们,我从前对你们说话,不能把你们当作属灵的,只得把你们当作属肉体,在基督里为婴孩的」(林前3:1)。

神在呼召他的教会长大成熟,被塑造成为耶稣基督的形像。我们必须断奶,学习吃干粮长大成熟而不只是变得年老。圣经说道:「我们有好些话,并且难以解明,因为你们听不进去。看你们学习的工夫,本该作师傅,谁知还得有人将神圣言小学的开端另教导你们,并且成了那必须吃奶、不能吃干粮的人!凡只能吃奶的,都不熟练仁义的道理,因为他是婴孩;惟独长大成人的,才能吃干粮,他们的心窍习练得通达,就能分辨好歹了」(来5:11-14)。

雅各给了我们一些未成熟的标记:

1. 不耐烦,尤其是在面对困难,敌对和逆境 时。

雅各说道:「我的弟兄们,你们落在百般 试炼中,都要以为大喜乐;因为知道你们 的信心经过试验,就生忍耐。但忍耐 也当成功,使你们成全完备,毫无缺欠」 (雅1:2-4)。

2. 没有实际行动。

雅各说道:「我的弟兄们,若有人说自己有信心,却没有行为,有什么益处呢?这信心能救他吗?」(雅2:14)有能力谈论和清楚地表达我们的信仰并不是成熟的标记。只有在我们把所知道和宣认的转化成行动以达致生命的改变和转化时才能显示成熟。约翰说道:「小子们哪,我们相爱,不要只在言语和舌头上,总要在行为和诚实上」(约壹3:18)。

3. 不能被人制服的舌头。

雅各说道:「各类的走兽、飞禽、昆虫、水族,本来都可以制伏,也已经被人制伏了;惟独舌头没有人能制伏,是不止息的恶物,满了害死人的毒气。我们用舌头颂赞那为

主、为父的,又用舌头咒诅那照着神形象被造的人。颂赞和咒诅从一个口里出来,我的弟兄们,这是不应当的」(雅3:7-10)。 未成熟的人无法控制他的舌头。

4. 争战,分裂和纷争。

雅各说道:「你们中间的争战、斗殴,是从哪里来的呢?不是从你们百体中战斗之私欲来的吗?你们贪恋,还是得不着;你们杀害嫉妒,又斗殴争战,也不能得。你们得不着,是因为你们不求:你们求也得不着,是因为你们妄求,要浪费在你们的宴乐中」(雅4:1-3)。雅各教导说信徒之间争战和争吵是有害的,它反映出他们的未成熟。

5. 世俗化或物质主义。

雅各说道:「嗐你们这些富足人哪,应当 哭泣,号啕,因为将有苦难临到你们身上。 你们的财物坏了,衣服也被虫子咬了。你 们的金银都长了锈;那锈要证明你们的不 是,又要吃你们的肉,如同火烧。你们在 这末世只知积攒钱财。工人给你们收割 庄稼,你们亏欠他们的工钱;这工钱有声音 呼叫,并且那收割之人的冤声已经入了万 军之主的耳了。你们在世上享美福,好宴 乐,当宰杀的日子竟娇养你们的心。你们 定了义人的罪,把他杀害,他也不抵挡你 们」(雅5:1-6)。雅各警告富足的压迫者对 自我放纵和采纳物质主义标准的危险,因 它反映了未成熟的心态。

我们需要长大和长大不等同于年龄的增长。成熟并不取决于年龄。在神拯救我们时,他的救恩是完全的。我们被呼召建造在神在我们生命中成就的完全救恩之上。正像一个小孩受到父母平衡的养育,在属灵方面,我们有神的话和神的灵来帮助话和爱方面,我们每天生活里。耶稣对尼哥人或者在我们每天生活里。耶稣对尼是从水和圣灵生的,就不能进神的国。从肉身生的,就是肉身;从灵生的,就是灵」(约3:5-6)。神的话赐予生命和圣灵给予引导和能力活出那生命。神的话带来信心的话观方看法。我们行事为人要凭神的话和灵施与膏抹。我们行事为人要凭神的话和

保罗把他渴望教会在基督里长大的强度比作怀孕的妇女在分娩时的阵痛。他说道:「我小子啊,我为你们再受生产之苦,直等到基督成形在你们心里」(加4:19)。虽然妇女在分娩期间经历最大的痛苦,这也是她生命中最辉煌的时刻,在那时她终于看到她孩子的诞生。痛苦和荣耀好像通往现实生活和生计的通道。在基督里灵命成熟是一个过程和并不是即刻产生的结果。就如在分娩期,它包含了阵痛,辛苦和痛苦。

在面对苦难,我们能够采取什么步骤来达到成熟?雅各告诉我们:

1. 「我的弟兄们,你们落在百般试炼中,都要以为大喜乐」(雅1:2)。 拥有喜乐的态度。

我们的态度将决定我们的行动。我们不要让艰难的处境或情况夺取我们的喜乐。是的,我们的肉体也许因痛苦而退缩,但是圣灵能帮助我们度过。我们能够像全能的神说道,「不是倚靠势力,不是倚靠才能,乃是倚靠我的灵方能成事」(亚4:6)。因靠耶和华而得的喜乐是我们的力量(尼8:10),非我们的智力,我们的能力或才能。凭着神的恩典和力量,我们能够在患难中喜乐。

2. 「你们中间若有缺少智慧的,应当求那厚赐与众人、也不斥责人的神,主就必赐给他」(雅1:5)。

依靠我们在得救后被更新的思想,祈求 神赐智慧。

我们不可依靠我们自然的思想,圣经称为存邪僻的心(罗1:28)——愚昧和不成熟的心。保罗说我们反而要依靠源于神的话语的教导。

3. 「忍受试探的人是有福的,因为他经过试验以后,必得生命的冠冕,这是主应许给那些爱他之人的」(雅1:12)。我们因对神的爱而放弃自己的意志。耶稣在客西马尼园中向天父祷告说,「求你将这杯撤去;然而,不要从我的意思,只要从你的意思」(可14:36)。耶稣坚忍到底而完成了天父的旨意。4. 「只是你们要行道,不要单单听道,自己欺哄自己」(雅1:22)。实践我们所听到的道。

仅仅通过教育和参加教会,研讨会和会议所获取的知识是不能够使我们长大成熟。只有当我们把我们所学习到的转变成行动时,我们才变得成熟。达到成熟的钥匙是在行事为人上服从神的话语。知道并不等于行道。

神呼召我们在他里面长大成熟,不只是年龄的增长,而是成长愈来愈像耶稣。让我们以神的话生活,它能带来信心,和让圣灵膏抹并赐能力给我们在灵命上成熟,以致我们能够像保罗一样说,「我作孩子的时候,话语像孩子,心思像孩子,意念像孩子;既成了人,就把孩子的事丢弃了」(林前13:10-11)。

he Bahasa Malaysia and Filipino Life Groups (LG) came together for the annual outing on 8 August 2009 at Desa Water Park, Kuala Lumpur. There were 24 domestic helpers who joined for the first time, including six Cambodians. This is the first time individuals from this nation were reached, in addition to reaching the Filipinas and the Indonesians.

In line with the outing to a water park, Associate Pastor David Seah shared a devotion from John 4 where Jesus revealed Himself as the Living Water to the Samaritan woman. She represented individuals who made wrong choices and were disappointed with life. Only Jesus, the Living Water can bring cleansing, healing and security.

Five individuals gave their hearts to Christ while four others rededicated their lives to the Lord! Among these were the Cambodians. Plans are now underway to start a Cambodian LG so that these precious ones can be discipled and grow in their knowledge of Christ.

At the Desa Water Park, peals of laughter were heard as the participants played the telematches organised. Later,

they enjoyed the water recreational activities under the sunny weather, some merrily sitting on floats while others excitedly slid down the water tubes again and again.

All the participants appreciated the Church for organising this outing. They were also thankful to their employers who allowed them to enjoy themselves with their friends.

One participant remarked that this was the best outing ever. Others were already talking about going for next year's outing. One employer commented that through this outing, her helper had a clearer understanding of who Jesus is and what it means to be a Christian.

It was indeed a fun-filled day. As they left the premises with happy memories of the pleasures water can bring, they were reminded that Jesus, the Living Water, alone brings true fulfillment and lasting sustenance in their lives.




