Walking in the Light of His Return

“ How then should you live in the light of Jesus’ return?

You are to keep yourselves clean (1 John 3:1-3).
Be faithful in your work (Luke 12:41-48).
Attend church. Church attendance is one way you can be kept ready for His return.”

“Now brothers, about times and dates we do not need to write to you, for you know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. While people are saying, “Peace and safety,” destruction will come on them suddenly, as labor pains on a pregnant woman, and they will not escape. But you brothers, are not in darkness so that this day should surprise you like a thief. You are all sons of the light and sons of the day. We do not belong to the night or to the darkness. So then, let us not be like others who are asleep, but let us be alert and self-controlled. For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, get drunk at night. But since we belong to the day, let us be self-controlled, putting on faith and love as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet.” (1 Thessalonians 5:1-8)

The Second Coming of the Lord will be sudden and unexpected. The apostle Paul likened it to the coming of a thief and the labour pains that come suddenly upon a pregnant woman. Both emphasise the surprise element when one is caught unawares. Paul encouraged the Thessalonians to be alert spiritually. He warned believers who are “drunk” and “asleep” not to live in a false paradise and not to sleepwalk spiritually. They are to watch out even when they think things are fine. Jesus can come at any moment! Unbelievers will be enjoying a time of false peace and security when Christ comes again. They will not heed God’s warnings and will be left behind to face great tribulation. But you can rejoice because it is not in God’s plan for believers to face the wrath and judgement of God.

“For God did not appoint us to suffer wrath but to receive salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. He died for us so that, whether we are awake or asleep, we may live together with Him. Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing” (1 Thessalonians 5:9-11). **There are three reasons why the Church will not go through tribulation:**

Firstly, Jesus is the head of the Church. The Church need not go through tribulation because Jesus, the head of the Church, has borne their judgement and delivered them from God’s wrath. “I tell you the truth, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be condemned; he has crossed over from death to life” (John 5:24).

Secondly, Christ’s Coming is to claim what He purchased on the cross. Christ is coming back for the Church for whom He has paid a price. He purchased all believers from judgement of sin and disobedience when He died on the cross. “He died for us so that, whether we are awake or asleep, we may live together with Him” (1Thessalonians 5:10).

Thirdly, Christ’s Coming is to bring comfort and not fear to the Church. Paul encouraged the Thessalonians to take comfort in Christ’s Coming. Believers are to rejoice in the great hope of escaping the tribulation and the wrath of God. “Then we who are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And thus we shall always be with

During the 45-minute recital, Professor Kim and Soo-Hyun Kim presented Johannes Brahms' *Ungarische Tanze*, No. 1, 2, 4, 5, 6 (one piano, four hands), Francis Poulenc's *Capriccio* from "*Le Bal Masque*" (two pianos) and Manuel Infante's *Dances Andalouses—Ritmo, Sentimental, Gracia* (two pianos). The Calvary Church Worship Orchestra and String Ensemble presented a repertoire of classical pieces and a medley of worship songs during the dinner.

It is uncommon for Calvary Church to hold services on a Monday night but on 1 October 2001, even before 7pm, the sanctuary was quickly filling up. There was a sense of excitement and anticipation in the air. Those who had attended the Calvaryland Charity Dinner Concert on Saturday night and the Sunday Morning Services at Calvary Church Damansara Heights had already been blessed by Grace Kim Cho's musical skills at the piano. Now they were eager to hear the wife of Rev. Dr David Yonggi Cho, Pastor of the largest church in the world, speak.

Despite her self-acknowledged limited ability to speak fluently in English, she nevertheless managed to communicate well with the congregation. Her humorous, yet practical anecdotes drew much laughter from the congregation. She spoke on a theme that everyone could identify with—problems that women faced—in particular, loneliness. At one point in her life, when Dr Cho was travelling very much, she was hit with the question, "Who am I?" Feeling that her life was empty, she broke down before God. She had a choice—to allow her desperation to lead to despair and eventually sin or to seek God to find out what she could do about it. She sought God, praised and worshipped Him and she received not only peace and new strength but a new purpose in life. God gave her a revelation that resulted in her studying music and subsequently serving Him around the world with her musical talent.

She encouraged the women to develop new skills, to stop complaining when they faced problems. Instead, they were to count their blessings, be contented and thankful to God.

"Thanksgiving breaks down barriers between God and us," she said. They are not to worry but to believe that God will make things better (Philippians 4:6).

The LG Leaders together with their members came out for the School of Christian Growth and the Prayer Meetings on Friday. Some of our LG Leaders led in worship while the LG members sang in the praise team. It was wonderful to see LGs presenting special numbers during the Prayer Emphasis Week, praying with togetherness and serving as ushers too. The encouragement to serve and to be involved come from belonging to a LG.

We have shown via LG promotion videos on Fridays and Sundays, how every Church worshipper can be part of the ‘action’: by visiting the sick in hospitals; ministering at Sunshine Home; reaching the lost; saturating the neighbourhood with Gospel tracts; helping in joyous occasions (wedding, Family Day); discipling through caring and sharing and also helping in times of crisis (when death takes place).

These represent the very life of a Christian community in a local church. All these ministry involvements are constantly experienced when you belong to a LG.

Throughout the LG promotion month in September, a total of 48 new visitors have visited our LGs.

Another highlight in that special month, was the installation of nine new LG Leaders and 12 new LGs. We now have a total of 142 LGs, with an average attendance of 1,150 people.

Those who came for our Friday Night Prayer Meetings were blessed by the worship, led by our own LG-grown worship leaders and praise teams, which consisted of capable LG Leaders and gifted LG members. “How and where did they develop the gift?” you may ask. The answer is obvious. It is at the LG meetings that they are given the opportunity to worship-lead and to develop their talents for God’s glory.

When the people learn to pray and worship in the LG, they will then do the same when they come together as a church in prayer and worship. It is vital therefore, for us to belong to a LG. 🙏





the Lord. Therefore comfort one another with these words” (1 Thessalonians 4:17-18 NKJV). The tribulation is not for believers but for the nation of Israel so that she might wake up and realise that Jesus Christ is her Messiah.

How then should you live in the light of Jesus’ return? You are to keep yourselves clean (1 John 3:1-3). Be faithful in your work (Luke 12:41-48). Attend church. Church attendance is one way you can be kept ready for His return. “Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching” (Hebrews 10:25). Let the hope of His return be an inspiration when you face difficult times (2 Corinthians 5:1-8). Let it motivate you to win the lost for Him (2 Corinthians 5:9-21).

Paul called the Thessalonians to live a holy life if they believed that Jesus was coming again. “Finally brothers, we instructed you how to live in order to please God, as in fact you are living. Now we ask you and urge you in the Lord Jesus to do this more and more. For you know what instructions we gave you by the authority of the Lord Jesus. It is God’s will that you should be sanctified: that you should avoid sexual immorality; that each of you should learn to control his own body in a way that is holy and honorable, not in passionate lust like the heathen, who do not know God” (1 Thessalonians 4:1-5). While Paul was pleased with the reports of their Christian walk, he urged them to do even better. **He gave four reasons why they should walk the walk of holiness:**

Firstly, to please God. The believer’s supreme motive is to please God. This was Jesus’ lifestyle when He was on earth. Jesus always pleased the Father. “The one who sent me is with me; he has not left me alone, for I always do what pleases him” (John

8:29). Enoch was another who pleased God. “... [Enoch] was commended as one who pleased God” (Hebrews 11:5). Pleasing God is more than doing the will of God. You can do the will of God and yet not please Him. A good example of this is Jonah. He initially did not obey God but when he finally did so, it was not to please God but to pacify Him and to save his own skin. He preached to the Ninevites as God commanded but became angry when they repented of their sins (Jonah 3 & 4)! Whatever you do, do it from your heart to please God. “Obey them [your earthly masters] not only to win their favor when their eye is on you, but like slaves of Christ, doing the will of God from your heart” (Ephesians 6:6).

Secondly, to obey God. God’s commands are given in His Word. Paul described the Christian as a soldier for Christ who is to do all He commands. “No one serving as a soldier gets involved in civilian affairs—he wants to please his commanding officer” (2 Timothy 2:4). God clearly prohibits adultery and fornication. “For you know what instructions we gave you by the authority of the Lord Jesus. It is God’s will that you should be sanctified: that you should avoid sexual immorality” (1 Thessalonians 4:2-3). “Marriage should be honored by all, and the marriage bed kept pure, for God will judge the adulterer and all the sexually immoral” (Hebrews 13:4). God created sex and therefore He is not against sex. God ordained marriage and His laws on sexual morality are to protect marriages and the joy of sex within marriage. When you obey His commandments, you do not have to live with guilt, shame and in filth.

Thirdly, to glorify God. You are to control your body in a way that is holy and honorable to God—to glorify Him. Your body is never meant for shame, to be misused and degraded. God has placed His life within your body so that

through this insignificant “earthly jar”, people can see the power of God. “But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us” (2 Corinthians 4:7). Paul says that you are to glorify God not just in your spirit but in your body as well. When you were saved, you received a new nature from God and your body can glorify God. Your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit. Therefore, you must ensure that it is clean. “Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your body” (1 Corinthians 6:19-20).

Fourthly, to escape punishment. Paul warned that if you do not live a holy life, you would be punished. God has no favourites and neither is He a respecter of persons. God is fair to all. If you sin, God deals with you. What the body sows, the body reaps. Believers are not exempted. Sinners, including believers who sin, will reap what they sow. “Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. The one who sows to please his sinful nature, from that nature will reap destruction; the one who sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life. Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest, if we do not give up” (Galatians 6:7-9).

The walk of holiness demands a right relationship with the Trinity—God the Father who called you, God the Son who died for you and God the Holy Spirit who makes your body the temple of God. When you have this right relationship, the Holy Spirit will create in you the right desires. He will teach you God’s Word, empower you, bear fruits in you and give you spiritual gifts. When the Trinity is working on your behalf, you cannot fail. You will be able to lead a holy life and will certainly please Him. When unbelievers see Christ in your life, they will either be envious and oppose you or desire to have what you have. Either way, God is glorified. You can never find a better hope than what Jesus can give you—the hope that He is coming back for you, the hope of eternal life after death. This truth should compel you to live your life on earth for Him and for His glory. 🙏


