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## **he Danger** Of **Neglecting Your Salvation**

"There are many who,
bit by bit and imperceptibly,
involve themselves in
some unsuspecting sin,
and suddenly awake to
a life of habitual sinful living."

"We must pay more careful attention, therefore, to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away.

For if the message spoken by angels was binding, and every violation and disobedience received its just punishment, how shall we escape if we ignore such a great salvation? This salvation, which was first announced by the Lord, was confirmed to us by those who heard him. God also testified to it by signs, wonders and various miracles, and gifts of the Holy Spirit distributed according to His will" (Hebrews 2:1-4).

There is a teaching amongst some Christian circles that once you are saved, you will never lose your salvation. This teaching is not consistent with the Word of God. The Bible says, "...but he who stands firm to the end will be saved" (Matthew 10:22). It is possible to repent, believe and confess Jesus as Lord and Saviour but if you do not continue in the faith, you can backslide. It is to the backsliders that the Bible says there is no way of escaping from the final wrath of God on Judgement Day. The Bible clearly warns of the dangers of neglecting your salvation. "If they escaped the corruption of the world by knowing our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and are again entangled in it and overcome, they are worse off at the end than they were at the beginning.... Of them the proverbs are true: 'A dog returns to its vomit,' and 'A sow that is washed goes back to her wallowing in the mud.'" (2 Peter 2:20, 22).

Firstly, take note of the warning found in the letter to the Hebrews. "We must pay more careful attention, therefore, to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away" (Hebrews 2:1). The word "we" refers to those who know and believe in Jesus. The warning then, is to the believer and not unbelievers. The word "must" emphasises the seriousness of the warning. There is no option to the believer as it says, "we must pay more careful attention" to the message or

truth heard and received. It is vital to take heed because you can drift away. To drift means to move somewhere gradually or slowly without a plan, to slip or glide. According to William Barclay, it is a thoughtless or careless act that allows your salvation to become lost. The danger of losing the gift of eternal life is not a sudden happenstance, but a slow drifting, slipping away. Therefore, be careful not to say, "Never mind, it's a little thing!" Solomon said it is the little foxes that spoil the vine. A Malay

proverb says, "Sedikit-sedikit, lama-lama menjadi bukit". The literal English translation is "Little by little, gradually becomes a hill". There are many who, bit by bit and imperceptibly, involve themselves in some unsuspecting sin, and suddenly awake to a life of habitual sinful living. Hence the need to warn believers of the danger of neglecting their salvation. The Bible says every sinner will be judged. You may have accepted Jesus a long time ago,

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## **Calvary Royal Rangers Outpost**



In 1982, through the vision of our Senior Pastor Prince Guneratnam and five men, the Royal Rangers Ministry at Calvary Church began in August with 25 boys in the Pioneers and Trailblazers Outposts. Meetings were held on Saturday afternoons at the education building. The next year, the Trail Rangers were added followed by the Straight Arrows and Buckaroos Outposts. From the beginning, the programme has provided both fun and opportunities to learn various skills for the boys. Under the guidance of our Senior Pastor and the able leadership of the Senior Commander together with the Commanders, the Outpost has grown and expanded to include many exciting programmes and events for the boys as well as the whole family. Today, we are one of the largest Outposts in Malaysia with 140 Rangers and leaders.

In conjunction with our anniversary, the Royal Rangers held a special celebration on 3 August 2002. The celebration began with a hi-tea fellowship at the Calvary Refreshment Centre before adjourning to the sanctuary for the main event. Our guest of honor for this event was Senior Pastor Prince Guneratnam who was welcomed with a special Guard of Honor. The programme for the day included a slide

presentation of our history, songs and skits presented by the Commanders, devotion by Associate Pastor Steven Kum, our Chaplain, and a presentation of the new advancement programme to be implemented in 2004.

One of the highlights of this event was the Gold Medal of Achievement (GMA) ceremony for two of our Rangers, Derek Lim and Victor Yee. The GMA is the highest award that can be earned by a Royal Ranger and only 22 have been awarded thus far in Malaysia (See accompanying story on the facing page). Councilmen Lim Sew Hok was also recognised for faithful and dedicated ministry in the Royal Rangers for the past 20 years.

A total of 244 Rangers, parents and guests attended this event along with representatives from five other Outposts and the National Royal Rangers. We praise God for His faithfulness and blessing these 20 years and are looking forward with great expectation for even greater things to come in the Royal Rangers Ministry. 🗥

## Our Rangers receive the Gold Medal of Achievement

The Gold medal of Achievement (GMA) is the highest advancement award in the Royal Rangers programme. In the past 20 years, only 22 Rangers in Malaysia have earned the right to wear this coveted medal.

The road to this day is not an easy one. It begins with the Trailblazers and Trail Rangers advancements trail. The requirements include seven advancement ratings that cover the four areas of a boy's development—physical, spiritual, mental and social.

In addition to the advancement, there are twelve compulsory award merits—Bible, Christian Service, Church, Camping, Citizenship, Nature Study, First Aid, Physical Fitness, Pathfinder, Weather, Wildlife and Wilderness Survival and seven elective merits that must be earned.

On completion of all the advancement requirements, there are another four steps before the candidate can qualify for this high honour. The candidate will need to read the "Royal Rangers Leader's Manual", write a 500 word essay on "The Value of Royal Rangers" and submit a statement of qualification together with his advancements merits to the National Royal Rangers Office.

The final step is an interview with the GMA review board consisting of members of the national and district staff. This interview is to ensure that the candidate is qualified and able to represent the high standards of the Royal Rangers programme.

On the recommendation of the Senior Commander and approval from the GMA review board, the candidate will be awarded the Gold Medal of Achievement and be commissioned to the rank of Junior Commander.

On 3 August 2002, at our 20th Anniversary Celebration, we honoured two young men who have achieved this level of excellence.

Victor Yee Whey Sern is a Trail Ranger aged 17 years. He joined the Royal Rangers in 1992 as a Buckaroo and has been actively involved in the Royal Rangers Ministry. He has served as assistant guide and patrol guide, been runners-up in the Outpost Ranger of the Year, completed the Junior Leaders' Training Camp and earned the Junior Leader's Service Award.

Derek Lim Jin Xiang is a Trail Ranger aged 17 years. He joined the Royal Rangers in 1990 as a Straight Arrow. He has served as patrol guide and senior guide, been Outpost Ranger of the Year, National Ranger of the Year finalist, completed the Junior Leaders' Training Camp, earned the Junior Leader's Service Award and is a member of the Frontiersman Camping Fellowship.







## There is one true God: Father, Son and

"The one true God has revealed himself as the eternally self-existent 'I AM,' the Creator of heaven and earth and the Redeemer of mankind. He has further revealed himself as embodying the principles of relationship and association as Father, Son and Holy Ghost."

"The Lord Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God."

Christians believe there is one God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. God is both one and three at the same time. For that reason,we speak of God as Trinity, and our belief in God as Trinitarian.

#### Illustrations

Many illustrations have been used to help understand the Trinity. The egg is one but is also composed of shell, white and yolk. Water may be present in three ways: liquid, steam or ice. A triangle is one but has three sides. Space is a unity but is three dimensional with width, length and depth. The human mind is one but has memory, understanding and will. While none of these illustrations is really adequate, they may be useful to show that the God who creates these kinds of tri-unity in nature may himself be characterized by tri-unity. What the Bible says about God must determine our belief.

#### The biblical witness

God revealed himself to Israel as one God, establishing monotheism (belief in one God) in sharp contrast to the polytheism (belief in many gods) of Israel's pagan neighbors. The ancient creed that God gave to His people to express their faith is called the Shema: "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one" (Deuteronomy 6:4, NIV). The Israelites were to recite it regularly and faithfully teach it to their children (Deuteronomy 6:7). Centuries later, Jesus, as a boy, learned that lesson and himself taught, as did the Jews of His day, that God is one (Mark 12:29; John 5:44). Likewise, the New Testament letters show that early Christians believed and taught "there is no God but one" (1 Corinthians 8:4; see James 2:19).

However, biblical belief in one God differs from that of other religions. The Old Testament hints in many ways that while God is one, His being is far more complex than might at first appear. For example, in addition to the activity of God in the creation story, the Spirit of God is also at work (Genesis 1:2) and often appears thereafter in the Old Testament. We also read about the Angel of the Lord (Exodus 23:23) who seems to be a divine Person. God's visit to Abraham shows Him in the company of others (Genesis 18:2). One of the Hebrew names for God, Elohim, that appears hundreds of times in the Old Testament, is plural in form. The Old Testament uses plural pronouns of God: "Let us make man in our image... " (Genesis 1:26; see also 3:22; 11:6,7). More than one divine Person is found in the conversation of Psalm 45:6.7: "Your throne, O God, will last for ever and ever...therefore God, your God, has set you above your companions" (see also Isaiah 48:12-16). None of these texts and narratives alone proves that God is triune. Taken together, they do suggest that the one God is in some way also nlural

In the New Testament, we are immediately confronted with a threefold manifestation of God. At the baptism of Jesus, the Spirit of God descended upon Him and a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:17; see also Mark 1:9-11; Luke 3:21,22). The baptismal narratives apparently intend to show that three divine Persons were simultaneously present and acting - the Father, who spoke from heaven; the Holy Spirit, who descended in the form of a dove; and Jesus, the Son of God, who, after His baptism in water, received the Spirit. The baptismal formula lists Father, Son and Spirit as distinct Persons (Matthew 28:19), as do many other New Testament texts (Romans 1:1-4; 1 Corinthians 12:4-6; 2 Corinthians 13:14: et al).

Moreover, the New Testament regularly identifies the Father as God (John 6:27); Jesus, also called the Word, as God (John 1:1); and the Holy Spirit as God (Acts 5:3,4). Each of the three is shown throughout the New Testament to have the attributes, or qualities, of deity such as omnipotence (all power), omniscience (all knowledge), and

omnipresence (everywhere and always present).

Each of the divine Persons often has a distinct role and is more prominent in one aspect of our redemption. The Father is associated with the plan of salvation (Ephesians 1:3-6). The Son assumed a human body in the Incarnation (John 1:14) in order to reveal God to us and die on the Cross as a substitute for our sins (Ephesians 1:7,8). The Holy Spirit applies the work of salvation in the new birth (John 3:5,6; Titus 3:5,6) and is our faithful witness and guide (Romans 8:14-16). In carrying out the work of redemption, the Son submits to the Father's will (Mark 14:35,36; John 17:4) and both the Father and the Son send the Holy Spirit to believers (John 14:16; 16:7).

Though indeed three Persons, the Trinity yet reflects a deep unity. Jesus frequently said such things as, "I and the Father are one" (John 10:30) and "I am in my Father" (John 14:20). He promised to send the Holy Spirit to live in His disciples and yet affirmed that He, too, would be in them (John 14:16-21). The regular linkage of their three names throughout the New Testament shows that they cannot be separated. If separated, they would be three gods, which is certainly not biblical.

#### The uniqueness of Jesus

Our Lord Jesus Christ is the supreme manifestation of the Triune God to humankind. Always present with Father and Spirit in eternity, the divine Son became fully human as Jesus of Nazareth for that purpose (Matthew 1:23; John 1:1,2,14; Hebrews 2:14). "Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father," Jesus said (John 14:9). "In the past God spoke to our forefathers through the prophets...but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son. ... The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word" (Hebrews 1:1-3).

"He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation" (Colossians 1:15). Our Lord, fully human and fully divine, "appeared once for all at the end of the ages to do away with sin by the sacrifice of himself" (Hebrews 9:26).

## **Holy Spirit**

#### **Our statement**

Though it says much about our Triune God, the Bible does not give a full explanation of His nature and inner relationships. Therefore, it took the Early Church several centuries to compare all the biblical texts, weigh their meanings, and agree on a statement. By the fourth century, the creeds (statements of belief) stated that God eternally is one divine essence manifested in three Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The three are not to be confused but neither can they be separated or divided. They are eternally equal in their divine nature but in their redemptive work the Son is subordinate to the Father and the Spirit subordinate to the Father and the Son. We in the Assemblies of God affirm historic Trinitarian doctrine in our Statement of Foundational Truths.

#### **Importance**

The doctrine of the Trinity is important because: (1) It best explains what the Bible teaches about God. (2) It shows how God's nature can be love (1 John 4:16) since long before there were angels or human beings to love, Father, Son and Holy Spirit existed in perfect fellowship and love for each other. (3) It best explains how God brings to pass our salvation since one Person of the Trinity, Jesus the divine Son, became human to reveal God, die an atoning death, and be resurrected on our behalf. (4) It sharply distinguishes Christianity from other faiths-both those who believe in one God and those who believe in many gods.

The Trinity is, and always has been, a mystery. If we were capable of fully understanding God, we would be His equal. Therefore, we take what the Bible says by faith and follow the wisdom of the historic church as it has been illuminated and guided by the Holy Spirit.

Helen Gan, a businesswoman, related how her Christian faith and principles helped her put priority in her client's interest before her own, thus enabling her to give her best to God. This has opened opportunities for God to bless her with more business. Bernadette Tay, a lecturer, shared how the Lord taught her to wait and allow Him to work out situations that were initially not favourable for her. Both praised the Lord for His faithfulness to them and for blessing the fruits of their labour.

A group of women then presented the song "Pass It On". Lanterns were lit and passed on to other women to symbolise that once we have experienced God's love, we want to pass it on. It was a beautiful sight.

Jeri Malek (a missionary to a special people group) referred to the story of the five loaves and two fishes in the sixth chapter of John. She described how Jesus received what a little boy offered to Him and turned something small to something with significant impact. When the boy saw the crowd of needy (hungry) people, he gave what someone else had given him—his five loaves and two fishes. After Jesus had blessed that, there was more than enough to feed 5,000 men.

Similarly too, we all have something which someone else has invested into our lives. We can take that and offer it to Jesus in a simple childlike manner. Whatever we have, be it time, money, talent or knowledge—and it may be just enough for us alone—but it is not too small or insignificant for Jesus to use to meet the needs around us.



"Lord Jesus, I give you my life to use as you please..."

Jeri Malek often felt like the little boy with only something someone else had given her. She learnt to put whatever she had in Jesus' hands and when He blessed that, the results were miraculous. She explained that whenever we keep what we have to ourselves because we are afraid that it would not be enough, then it will only be enough for us. We therefore have to learn to give what we have to Jesus. Jesus was not looking at the little boy's lunch but at his attitude towards what he had. She encouraged us to hold loosely whatever we have and to offer that to Jesus to use.

She concluded by testifying how the Lord enabled her to start a Bible club for an unreached children's group in Spain, a Bible club for street kids in France and a Women's Bible Study group in Africa. She urged the women present to simply give what they have to Jesus and experience the miraculous in their lives.

While most of the women had a delightful time of fellowship over refreshments, some took time to learn to make ribbon roses and greeting cards. It was an afternoon well spent.

but if your heart is not right with God and you are living like an unbeliever, if you die today as a backslider, there is no way of escaping the final wrath and judgement of God.

Secondly, consider the warning found in the familiar story of the rich young man who asked Jesus, "What good thing must I do to get eternal life?" Jesus told him, "Obey the commandments" (Matthew 19:17) and the young man promptly declared that he had kept all the commandments ever since he was a boy. Then Jesus said, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell your possessions and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me" (Matthew 19:21). "When the young man heard this, he went away sad, because he had great wealth" (Matthew 19:22). Jesus was not saying that wealth is sinful but He was simply asking, "Who is first in your life?" Jesus was emphasising the importance of having the right priority. You have to put God first to have eternal life. This man thought he was doing everything that was pleasing to God. He never realised that as he pursued material wealth, it gradually became the master of his life. His great wealth instead of God had become his priority. The Scripture said he was sad and walked away (Matthew 19:22). Beware of how subtly sin can creep into your life. God is not "dethroned' in your life overnight! It is a slow process. It is a kind of drifting that brings you into the bondage of sin.

Consider this third warning. When teaching about the cost of discipleship, Jesus said, "No one who puts his hand to the plow and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God" (Luke 9:62). You are not fit for the kingdom of God when your look causes you to sin and go after sinful pleasures. Remember the story of Lot's wife? Despite being warned, she turned and looked back and was turned into a pillar of salt immediately.

Fourthly, consider Jesus' warning addressed to the Church of Ephesus in the book of Revelation. Although it was a church praised for its good works (Revelation 2:2-3), Jesus said, "Yet I hold this against you: You have forsaken your first love. Remember the height from which you have fallen! Repent and do the things you did at first. If you do not repent, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place" (Revelation 2:4-5). Do you boast about how disciplined you are in giving, at serving and doing as a believer? But all these can be in vain if your first love for

Jesus is missing. Whatever reason you may have and no matter how legitimate it may look, if it robs you of your first love for God, it can cause you to backslide.

The warnings to believers are very clear-do not neglect your salvation. If those who violated and disobeyed the message spoken by angels (the Mosaic Law) received judgement, how can those who ignore the message of salvation announced by the Lord Himself not be more severely judged? "For if the message spoken by angels was binding, and every violation and disobedience received its just punishment, how shall we escape if we ignore such a great salvation? This salvation which was first announced by the Lord, was confirmed to us by those who have heard him" (Hebrews 2:2-3). Therefore, if you believe in Jesus and then turn your back on Him, there is no way you can escape the wrath of God in the end.

The writer of Hebrews says, "How shall we escape if we ignore such a great salvation?" What makes our salvation great?

#### 1. The nature of your salvation.

Salvation brings you into a relationship with God as your heavenly Father. Once you are saved and your sins have been forgiven, you are able to come to God in prayer and ask Him to bless and anoint you in Jesus' name.

#### 2. The means of your salvation.

God paid a high price for your salvation—He made the biggest bid—His only begotten Son—so that nobody can outbid Him for you (John 15:13). Jesus died for you on the cross to forgive your sins and purchase a place for you in heaven. There is no other way to be saved but by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12).

#### 3. The witness of salvation.

Firstly, Jesus Himself testifies that He brings you salvation. He lived, died on the cross and on the third day was resurrected. The coming of the Holy Spirit is proof of His resurrection. He told His disciples that He would be going to the Father and that He would send the Holy Spirit to them. Speaking in tongues after being baptised in the Holy Spirit is a powerful witness of the believer's salvation. Secondly, the changed lives of the Apostles and believers confirm His salvation. And thirdly, God Himself, through the power of the Holy Spirit, performs signs and

wonders to prove His salvation.

Here are five biblical steps that will help you safeguard your salvation:

1. Appropriate the blood of Jesus daily. Stay under the blood. It was under the covering of the blood that the first born of the children of Israel escaped death. "How much more, then, will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from acts that lead to death, so that we may serve the living God!" (Hebrews 9:14).

#### 2. Continually draw near to God.

Pray everyday. If you do not know how to pray, join organised prayer meetings or attend a fellowship near you, where you can learn to pray in small groups. "Let us draw near to God with a sincere heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience..." (Hebrews 10:22).

3. Gather often with God's people.

"Let us not give up meeting together; as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching" (Hebrews 10:25). You may not always feel like coming to fellowship or to pray, but you will be encouraged and rejuvenated spiritually when you do come.

#### 4. Endure hardship as God's discipline.

"Endure hardship as discipline: God is treating you as sons. For what son is not disciplined by his father?" (Hebrews 12:7) If there is no pain, there is no gain. You need to persist and persevere after the things of God.

#### 5. Be a doer of the Word.

Do not just be a listener. Obey God. Do what He has revealed and wants you to do. "Do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased" (Hebrews 13:16).

The challenge is, "...he who stands firm to the end will be saved" (Matthew 10:22). We do not backslide overnight. It a slow process. Therefore, do not neglect the wonderful gift of salvation. "Be careful that you do not forget the Lord, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery" (Deuteronomy 6:12).
