The Ministry of Restoration

It has been said that the only army who inflicts more wounds or kills its wounded is the Christian army. When someone who is born-again falls into sin, the Church is often quick to bring condemnation. The fallen believer finds no comfort in the Church and dares not come to Church. So what does he do? He seeks comfort, strength and encouragement in the world. The Church, besides being involved in evangelism-preaching the Gospel-must also be involved in the restoration of believers who have fallen. The fallen believer must never be too embarrassed and ashamed to come to the Church to be helped, encouraged and to love and serve the Lord as before. The Church is built on Calvary-the mount of redemption. This means we repent of our sin and accept God's forgiveness to live in victory over sin. Restoration includes showing a person his mistake as well as helping him to know how to come out of it.

The apostle Paul clearly encourages the ministry of restoration. "Brethren, if a man is overtaken in any trespass (sin)...restore such a one" (Galatians 6:1). The word "brethren" tells us that Paul was addressing believers and therefore calling believers into this ministry. The word "man" refers to a person of like passion, who has desires and faces temptations like you. Must a man commit a specific sin, for example, adultery, before he is considered to be

a fallen believer that needs to be restored? The phrase "overtaken in any trespass" indicates all sins-regardless of its nature, despicable, harmful or seemingly harmless-are included. The word "overtaken" tells us that this sin can be committed unexpectedly, as a true believer does not live a life of habitual sinning. Paul, in his writing to the Galatian Christians, gives us some biblical principles regarding the restoration of fallen believers.

The ministry of restoration is to be done not only by pastors and Christian leaders but by those who are spiritual (Galatians 6:1). How do you know if you are spiritual? There are four qualities that you must have. Firstly, your life is crucified with Christ. "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for

adultery with Bathsheba and the murder of her husband, Uriah, to cover-up his wrongdoing. Absalom followed in his father's footsteps and became a murderer. He ordered that his brother Amnon be killed (2 Samuel 13:28) and he became a sexual predator (2 Samuel 16:22). Absalom had a spirit of deception (2 Samuel 15:4-5). He wanted the blessings of God that his father enjoyed, without the spirituality that accompanied it.

Senior Pastor warned against child neglect . Children want time with their fathers and not the material things they can give them.

David failed to discipline his son. The Bible supports the disciplining of children (Proverbs 13:24; 19:18). Discipline proves that we are sons and not illegitimate children (Hebrews 12:5-12). Discipline brings rest and relief in days of adversity

Datin Paduka Seripah Noli binti Syed Hussin, Selangor Executive Councillor for Welfare and Women's Affairs, who represented the Menteri Besar of Selangor, Dato' Seri Dr Mohamad Khir bin Toyo and Senior Pastor Prince Guneratnam used two back hoes to break the ground.

Among the guests present were Pastors and Deacons of Calvary Church, General Council officials and local community leaders. In his dedication prayer, Senior Pastor who is the chairman of Calvaryland, prayed that the future residents of Calvaryland would experience God's love and believe in Him.

Construction of Phase 1 (which began in July) is scheduled to be completed by July next year. Phase 1 will have a gross built-up area of over 100,000 sq. ft. and can

accommodate up to 250 residents comprising babies, children, unwed mothers, women in crisis, the elderly and the homeless aged.

Phases 2 and 3 will cater to another 200 residents consisting of teenage boys, rehabilitated drug addicts, former prisoners, HIV positive people and the terminally ill.

Besides the different homes for the residents, Calvaryland will also have amenities such as an administrative block, auditorium, multi-purpose hall, classrooms, multi-purpose rooms, medical rooms, library, computer room, landscaped park and field. Spread over 10 acres, Calvaryland is designed and planned to provide a home-like environment of healing and nurturing for the poor, needy and the hurting. Training will be provided to equip the residents with relevant vocational and living skills.

Thus far, most of the funding for Calvaryland has been provided by Calvary Church missions through our Faith Promise giving.

The Secrets of Sowing

On this Faith Promise Sunday, Rev. Rodgers said that the level of our giving could change the course of our lives. God wants us to have good health, to have finances and to be blessed of the Lord in our spirit (3 John 2). He spoke of five secrets of sowing and receiving what God has promised to us.

Secret 1: God has keys to open the doors of blessing. It is His will that we are all blessed but there are three duties expected of every believer (Matthew 6). Give. Pray. Fast. With such background, how then can we know how to tell our children about sex and when is the right time to tell them? It was with such burning interest and concern that more than 100 parents and others who are involved with children and youth ministries, were present for a one day seminar on "How And When To Tell Your Kids About Sex" by Dr. Stanton L. Jones held on 17 July 2004 at Pusat Aktiviti Calvary, Damansara Perdana.

Dr. Jones emphasised the principle that sex education is a life-long

approach to shaping your child's sexual character and we must understand that it is much more than just information. Teaching biology is not equated to teaching human sexuality.

Nowadays, children and young people are exposed to so many distorted views of sexuality which are prevalent all around us especially in the media. These seem to be their only source of information because parents struggle with talking about sex. There seems to be no message from them. They are silent. So, they base their understanding of sexuality on these distorted views.

The participants were given insights into the following four areas relating to sex education as a lifelong approach. What does God think about sex?; Laying the foundation: Sexuality and the young child; Building the structure: The elementary school years and Weathering the storm: Puberty into adolescence.

Some of the highlights of the seminar included very thought provoking discussions on the following: The proper order for understanding the

Bible's message about sexuality; What are some of your greatest fears when it comes to educating your children in the area of sexuality?; What are some ways you can help to surround your child with the symbols of the truth?; How to handle sexual curiosity, sex play, manners etc?; Why talk to young children about sexual pleasure? Questions from the audience were also addressed during these sessions.

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, selfcontrol" (Galatians 5:22-23). Thirdly, your walk is consistent with what you profess. Your lifestyle reflects your talk. "If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit" (Galatians 5:25). And lastly, you must be free from being "superspiritual" and not have a "holier than thou" attitude. "Let us not become

Restoration is to be handled in a spirit of meekness (Galatians 6: 1). Meekness is not weakness. A spirit of meekness has a loving attitude but does not condone sin. It is not hard, harsh or judgmental. It is the opposite of a spirit of criticism. censorship or rejection which will turn the fallen believer to the world rather than to God. It cares without compromising. It forgives because God forgives but it also disciplines. It is a gentle yet tremendous power that is under control. Imagine a Japanese sumo wrestler holding a baby. The restorer is to reach out with love and humility, understanding what the fallen believer is going through, yet not condoning the sin, and help him to walk with the Lord again. "I, therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you to walk worthy of the calling with which you were called, with all lowliness and gentleness, with longsuffering, bearing with one another in love..." (Ephesians 4:1-2). "...in humility correcting those who are in opposition, if God perhaps will grant them repentance, so that they may know the truth" (2 Timothy 2:25).

You must "consider yourself" (Galatians 6:1) and beware that you do not fall into sin while you try to help another. "You therefore, beloved, since you know this beforehand, beware lest you also fall from your steadfastness, being led away by the error of the wicked" (2

Peter 3:17). No one is exempted from being tempted by sin. Even Jesus faced temptation. "For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin" (Hebrews 4:15).

Bearing one another's burdens is not an option for the believer (Galatians 6:2). The law in the life of the believer is love. Jesus bore your burdens. He carried your sins when He was on the cross. His crucifixion was an expression of His love for you. Jesus said, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:34-35). Therefore, help to bear the burden of the one who has fallen. Love and restore him.

You must not deceive vourself into thinking that you are something when you are nothing except by the grace of God (Galatians 6:3). A believer is a forgiven sinner and is not more superior than another. Jesus told a parable that teaches this. He said, "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess.' And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted" (Luke 18:10-14). The only reason you can come alongside the

fallen believer to pray for him and to help restore him is because of God's grace in your life. It has nothing to do with your own merit. With that understanding, you minister to the one who has fallen without condemning him.

Examine your own work (Galatians 6:4). The word "work" refers to your conduct and behaviour. You are to examine your own life. The

Psalmist said, "Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me and know my anxieties and see if there is any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting" (Psalm 139:23-24). When the Holy Spirit searches your heart, you will be able to see the true picture of yourself and the possibility of ugliness within you. Judgement must begin with you before you can judge another. "First remove the plank from your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye" (Matthew 7:5). You are ready to restore another when your own life is right with God and you are not judgmental.

Every believer has burdens, faults and imperfections to live with and each one has a duty and responsibility to take care of them (Galatians 6:5). When you understand and accept this, you can then be a blessing to others who are struggling.

There are believers who have fallen and are hurting today. They do not need condemnation but someone to show them that God still loves and cares for them. God has called the Church to a ministry of restoration. He has called you to be a spiritual man and you can restore the one who has fallen. With the Lord's help, you can help him to repent, to appeal to a loving God as David did, to confess his sin, ask for cleansing and for God to create in him a clean heart and to restore to him the joy of his salvation (Psalm 51).
