ALL THINGS ARE POSSIBLE
PASTOR CHAN LEE PENG

The phrase, "with God all things are possible," is a statement that proclaims God's absolute sovereignty and infinite power. We find the original context of this phrase in the account of the rich young ruler (Matthew 19:16-26) who came to Jesus to find out what he must do to have eternal life. He went away sorrowful because Jesus had told him that apart from keeping the law, he needed to do one more thing: sell his possessions and give to the poor. Jesus then said to His disciples, "It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than

for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." The disciples were greatly astonished because riches were often looked upon in the culture as a sign of God's blessing and favour. It was the rich who built synagogues, gave alms to the poor and funded important projects. If anyone could be saved, surely it was the rich. But if they could not even enter the kingdom of heaven by their noble efforts, then who else could be saved? Jesus responded by saying, "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible." It is impossible for men to be saved by works. Salvation is only possible through faith in God and solely by His grace.

All things are possible with God but that does not obviate us from the need to do our part, a point Jesus emphasized in the gospel account of the healing of a demon-possessed boy with a mute spirit (Mark 9:17-29). The disciples could not cast out the spirit and as a last resort, the boy's distraught father came to Jesus albeit with doubt in his heart. Jesus said to him, "If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes," to which the father responded, "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief!" Jesus rebuked the unclean spirit and the boy was set free. The father had a part to play in the healing of his son viz. to believe.

The two accounts above where Jesus declares "All things are possible with God" illustrate an important truth: if He has taken care of our greatest need i.e. our need for salvation and defeated Satan, our ultimate and most formidable enemy, is there anything He is not capable of doing on our behalf? If His power was sufficient to meet these needs that are impossible for us humanly speaking, surely it is sufficient for all our lesser needs in life. There is nothing that is impossible with God. Absolutely nothing.

Our task then is to pray and believe. It is God's prerogative to answer our prayers however He sees fit. We will follow the example of our Lord Jesus who humbly laid down His will, "Abba, Father, all things are possible for You. . . nevertheless, not what I will, but what You will" (Mark 14:36, NKJV).

CALVARY CHURCH CONSTITUTION



As we look to the future of Calvary Church, we recognize it is essential to have continual development and growth, an open and inclusive membership, and a governance model that is aligned with our God-given vision to be a fountainhead church. We are excited to announce the adoption of a new Church Constitution, effective 1 July 2024.

The new constitution marks a significant shift from a congregational-led model to a church council-led model of governance. It embraces a pluralistic model of leadership, similar to the early New Testament churches as in Acts 20:17-28, Titus 1:5-7, 1 Peter 5:1-2.

Why A Need to Navigate Change

Our previous Church Constitution, adopted in 1985, has faithfully served us for nearly four decades. While it has been adequate for our congregation until now, we are embarking on changes to elevate Calvary Church to new heights. These changes will help us grow into a future where we envision full and multiple services in the Calvary Convention Centre. Below, you will find illustrations detailing our new governance model:



From Vision to Reality: A Six-Year-Process of Collaborative Refinement

In 2018, our late Senior Pastor took the first steps towards this transformation by forming the Constitution Task Force. Initially, it included himself, an Associate Pastor, our church elder, a Deacon, and a constitutional advisor. Over time, the team expanded to include three Associate Pastors and two Deacons, each bringing valuable insights.

Between August and September of 2023, we held 15 briefings for our church members. Of the 481 members who attended, the task force reviewed 176 feedback points, working diligently to refine the draft constitution. On Sunday, 21 April 2024, we presented the final draft constitution and the initial members of the new Church Council to the members.



The New Constitution Adopted

On Sunday, 28 April 2024, at an Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM), our voting members overwhelmingly supported the new constitution, which will take effect from 1 July 2024. The EGM also affirmed the appointment of members of the first Church Council (refer to the right):

We thank God for the Calvary family's dedication and hard work, creating an unforgettable celebration that honoured fathers and highlighted the importance of reflecting God's boundless love.




The children were also a blessing, preparing Father's Day themed arts and craft for their dads. They enjoyed a special lesson and skit prepared by the teachers.

11 May 2024 – In conjunction with Mother's Day, women who attended the Sunday worship received over 800 beautiful origami hearts, lovingly folded by 30 young people and children. Each heart was inscribed with a Scripture verse to symbolise the theme – Reflecting God's Love.



Calvary Church took the opportunity to celebrate and show appreciation to all mothers. Some of the highlights of the service included performances by the One Voice choir, a heart-warming sermon by Interim Senior Pastor Petrina Guneratnam, as well as an uplifting testimony by Pastor Margaret Seaward on God's grace.

Sister Petrina, whom many of us regard as Calvary's spiritual mother, spoke about how every woman has a maternal instinct. This is the reason we take this day to honour, not just biological mothers, but all women. She



reminded us that honouring our mothers (and fathers) is the only commandment in the Bible that has a reward of long life attached to it.

Honouring our mothers (parents) is demonstrated by loving them unconditionally, giving them priority, esteeming them highly so they know their worth, as well as carrying out small acts of gratitude so that they know they are appreciated.

Mid-sermon, Sister Petrina segued to a testimony video by Pastor Margaret Seaward who is her spiritual mother and mentor. In her testimony, Pastor Seaward spoke of her journey raising five children and leading them to salvation.

While four of her children went on to serve God in ministry, one of her sons ended up going to prison. Pastor Seaward never ceased praying for him and learned that it was important to

release him into God's hands. It was a very difficult time as she prayed for her son daily, for over 20 years! The congregation was encouraged to hear that her son returned to the Lord and has now been serving in ministry for the past 20 years.

Sister Petrina then wrapped up her sermon talking about the six important attributes of faith shown by the Canaanite woman in Matthew 15: 21 – 29. These attributes are to encourage mothers not to give up and to continue to pray for their children. The altars then opened for a time of prayer and many responded to God's Word.

Service ended with another special song by the One Voice choir, followed by a time of fellowship over light refreshments in the plaza.

在神凡事都能

“在神凡事都能”，这句话宣示了神的绝对主权和无限能力。我们在年轻财主的故事（马太福音 19：16-26）中找到这句话的原始背景。他前来询问耶稣，他要做什么善事才可以得着永生。耶稣告诉他，除了遵守诫命，他还需要变卖他所有的，分给穷人。他听了后忧心忡忡地走了。耶稣接着对门徒说：“骆驼穿过针眼，比有钱的人进神的国还容易

呢！”门徒十分惊讶，因为在当时的文化，财富常常被视为神赐福和眷顾的标志。有钱人建造会堂，施舍穷人，资助重要项目。如果说谁能得救，那肯定是有钱人。但是，如果他们通过自己高尚的努力都不能进入天国，那么还有谁能得救呢？耶稣回答说：“在人这是不能的，在神却凡事都能。”人不可能靠行为得救。只有通过神的信心和神的恩典，才能得到救赎。

在神凡事都能，但这并不表示我们不需要尽自己的本分。福音书中关于耶稣

医治被哑巴鬼附着的男孩（马可福音 9：17-29）便强调了这一点。当时门徒无法把鬼赶出去，男孩心急如焚的父亲只能带着疑惑来到耶稣面前。耶稣对他说：“你若能信——对于信的人，什么都能！”孩子的父亲立刻喊着说：“我信！但我的信心不够，求你帮助我。”耶稣斥责那污鬼，鬼出来，男孩就自由了。在医治儿子的过程中，父亲的责任是相信。

上述两个故事中，耶稣宣告“在神凡事都能”，说明了一个重要的真理：如果他已经满足了我们最大的需要，即我们的救赎，并且打败了撒旦——我们终极和最可怕的敌人，那还有什么是他不能为我们做的呢？如果他的能力足以满足我们人类不能实现的需要，那么他的能力肯定也足以满足我们生活中所有的小需要。在神，没有不可能的事。绝对没有。

我们的任务是祷告并相信。神有权以他认为合适的方式回应我们的祷告。我们要效仿主耶稣，他谦卑地放下自己的意愿。他说：“阿爸、父啊，你凡事都能作，求你叫这杯离开我。但不要照我的意思，只要照你的旨意。”（马可福音 14：36）

DENGAN TUHAN SEGALA SESUATU MUNGKIN

Ungkapan, "dengan Tuhan segala sesuatu mungkin terjadi," merupakan pernyataan yang mengisytiharkan kedaulatan mutlak dan kuasa-Nya yang tidak terhingga. Konteks asal ungkapan ini didapati dalam kisah orang muda yang kaya (Matius 19:16-26) yang datang kepada Yesus untuk bertanya cara memperoleh hidup yang kekal. Beliau beredar dari situ dengan sedih kerana diberitahu Yesus, selain mematuhi taurat, beliau hendaklah melakukan satu lagi perkara: menjual hartanya dan sedekahkan kepada golongan miskin. Yesus kemudian berkata kepada murid-murid-Nya, "Lebih mudah seekor unta masuk melalui lubang jarum daripada seorang kaya

masuk ke dalam Kerajaan Tuhan." Murid-murid-Nya sangat hairan kerana dalam kebudayaan mereka, kekayaan dipandang sebagai tanda berkat dan perkenan Tuhan. Golongan kayalah yang mendirikan rumah ibadat, bersedekah kepada golongan miskin, dan membiayai projek penting. Jika adanya sesiapa yang mampu diselamatkan, tentulah golongan kaya. Tetapi jikalau mereka pun tidak layak memasuki kerajaan syurga melalui usaha murni mereka, maka siapa lagi yang dapat diselamatkan? Yesus menjawab, "Bagi manusia hal ini tidak mungkin, tetapi bagi Tuhan segala sesuatu mungkin." Penyelamatan hanya mungkin melalui iman dalam Tuhan dan semata-mata melalui kasih karunia-Nya.

Segala sesuatu mungkin bagi Tuhan tetapi itu tidak menghalang kita melaksanakan peranan masing-masing, sesuatu yang ditekankan Yesus dalam kisah injil perihai penyembuhan seorang anak yang dirasuk roh bisu (Markus 9:17-29). Murid-murid tidak berjaya mengusir roh tersebut dan sebagai jalan terakhir, bapa anak tersebut yang bingung datang berjumpa Yesus, walaupun dalam hatinya ada keraguan. Yesus berkata kepadanya, "Jika anda percaya, tiada yang mustahil bagi orang yang percaya," lalu dijawab bapa itu, "Tuhan, aku percaya; tolonglah ketidakpercayaanku!" Yesus menegur roh jahat itu dan anak tersebut dibebaskan. Bapanya memainkan peranan dalam penyembuhan anaknya, iaitu untuk percaya.

Dua kisah di atas di mana Yesus menyatakan, "Segala sesuatu mungkin dengan Tuhan" menggambarkan kebenaran penting: jika Dia telah memenuhi keperluan terpenting kita, iaitu keperluan penyelamatan kita dan menewaskan Iblis, musuh kita yang paling hebat, adakah apa-apa yang tidak mampu dilakukan-Nya bagi pihak kita? Jika kuasa-Nya mampu memenuhi keperluan ini yang mustahil untuk kita sebagai manusia, tentu ia mencukupi untuk semua keperluan hidup kita yang lebih kecil. Tiada yang mustahil bagi Tuhan. Langsung tiada.

Oleh itu, tugas kita adalah berdoa dan percaya. Ianya adalah hak istimewa Tuhan untuk memakbulkan doa kita sebagaimana yang Dia fikirkan layak. Kita akan meneladani Yesus yang dengan rendah hati mengenepikan kehendak-Nya, "Ya Abba, ya Bapa, tiada yang mustahil bagi-Mu... tetapi janganlah apa yang Aku kehendaki, melainkan apa yang Engkau kehendaki" (Markus 14:36).

DAWNING OF NEW LIFE IN CHRIST

My name is Marhandran, I come from a Hindu background. A rebel in my youth, I was very involved in violence and was addicted to alcohol, as well as other substances. My bad habits improved slightly over the years but I was still the same person, full of anger, hatred, and unforgiveness.

Along the way, I met my wife who was a Roman Catholic. We got married in a church and were soon blessed with two boys. I went to church with my family on occasional Sundays but my old challenges, bad habits, and attitude remained.

Things began to change after my family and I began attending Calvary Church about five years ago. We were more attentive to the services, especially for the sake of the children. Unfortunately, this connection with the church was lost during the Movement Control Order when I started drifting away.

Throughout this time, I still faced a lot of problems with my family, and at work as well. A turning point came when I questioned God, “Why is all this happening to me?” When a voice responded, “Everything happens for a reason; wait for the right time.” At first, I thought I was going through mental issues as I was now hearing voices!

I continued living my life in misery, denying my family’s happiness and peace. Despite the struggles, I began attending My Faith classes in August last year as I wanted to be baptised in water and be a member of Calvary Church.

One morning, I could not sleep and cried out to Jesus as I was so heartbroken. I’d hurt my family a day before and was truly regretful of my actions. I told God, “I am done with this life.” I gave up as I did not wish to live in this world anymore and continue to hurt and burden my family.

Without realising, I was weeping and had started to speak in tongues (my first time). I was not quite sure of what was happening around me at that point but I felt God by my side, comforting me in my most painful moments, and at the same time receiving the baptism of the Holy Spirit.

Since that morning, I am a changed person. God has done the impossible – I am now able to forgive and forget, as well as to let go of unwanted hatred. I was water-baptised last week along with my family and we are going all out to serve in various church ministries and wherever the Lord may lead us.

All praise and glory to God! He has assured me that old things have passed away and He will never leave nor forsake me.



DARKEST BEFORE DAWN

My name is Katherine. I thank God for His grace, mercy, and unfailing love when my husband passed away suddenly in June of 2022. I was completely thrown off balance as this happened suddenly – just three hours prior, we were still praying with him in the hospital for a full recovery.

I felt like a child abandoned by the parent who left, taking the other child with Him. I asked the Lord what my husband did right that qualified him to go home, and why I missed out that I did not qualify to go home. Why did God leave me behind to go through the pain and shame of being a widow? In the Chinese culture, I was also considered a bad omen that caused my husband's demise.

I COULDN'T MAKE SENSE OF THE RIOT OF EMOTIONS AND NOTHING I HAD LEARNED ABOUT GOD MADE ANY SENSE EITHER.

I couldn't make sense of the riot of emotions and nothing I had learned about God made any sense either. This was too cruel for me; it was utterly unfair! Because losing a spouse is such a painful and traumatic experience. My husband and I had agreed that we

should go home together when the time came, when the children had grown up. "Lord," I asked, "What disqualified me?"

Everything that well-meaning people said to me did not make sense – especially when they told me, "He's in a better place." Sorry, but this was exactly what I was struggling with – my husband is in a better place while I was suffering here!

I tried going away for months to recuperate; I buried myself in my work, to no avail I was still broken and bruised inside. I just wanted to get away from the pain.

The whirlwind and tempest calmed when I daily sat in the presence of the Lord for hours on end. He didn't say anything, He was just there. I too didn't say anything for I knew He knows everything and He was in my pain, my shame, my sense of abandonment.

In that stillness, within the silence, He was healing me, bandaging my deepest wound with the balm of His love, grace, and mercy.

Last April, while I visited my daughter's family in Sweden, I thought God had finally relented and was granting my wish to go home to Him. I waited each

night after my devotion time with God.

One night, the Lord spoke clearly to me, "I am not taking you home, you will go back to Malaysia. You will not die here – I have work for you." I felt a sense of strength and purpose flowing back into my body. I slept that night free of the recurrent dreams of loved ones who had already passed on.

Last June, on the first anniversary of my husband's passing, we decided to scatter his ashes into the sea. That was closure for me as the Lord continued to lead me to live in the present, and not the past. God had demonstrated to me, over and over, that I could trust Him, even in the darkest moments of my life.


